**REQUEST:** To address The Tenth Annual Congressional Awards dinner sponsored by the Committee for Education Funding.

**PURPOSE:** To honor outstanding advocacy for federal investment in education. This event would provide an opportunity to be honored for his leadership in education. Also, two Congressional leaders -- Senators Edward M. Kennedy and James M. Jeffords -- will be honored with lifetime achievement awards for education advocacy.  
(While the hour of the event is not ideal for press' coverage, the continued support of participating organizations is essential to our efforts.)

**BACKGROUND:** This is the one annual event in which the entire education community - - encompassing preschool through graduate school and adult learning -- comes together to recognize public officials who strive to make the education of America's students a top federal budget priority.

The Committee for Education Funding, the nation's largest education coalition, is a voluntary, nonpartisan, and nonprofit organization representing both public and private education. The Tenth Annual Awards Dinner marks a major milestone in its 26 year history.
