Summary

This collection consists of records related to Warren Tsuneishi. Tsuneishi was one of the greeters to meet President and Mrs. Clinton when they arrived at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific. He was also present at the ceremony where President Clinton gave the capstone speech honoring the 50th Anniversary of World War II. This collection consists of a schedule, a list of participants and attendees, a biography, and veteran information forms related to the fiftieth anniversary of the end of the war in the Pacific.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2011-0387-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials. Warren Tsuneishi was a veteran of the Military Intelligence Service during World War II and translator for the Army in the Pacific. He received the Bronze Star Medal. On September 2, 1995 Sergeant Tsuneishi was one of the greeters to meet President and Mrs. Clinton when they arrived at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific. He was also present at the ceremony where President Clinton gave the capstone speech honoring the 50th Anniversary of World War II. Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas — Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files, Clinton Presidential Records: WJC Schedules. White House Staff and Office Files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and documents all levels of administration activity. Staff and Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.

Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 USC 2201) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 USC 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.

Copyright

Documents in this collection that were prepared by officials of the United States government as part of their official duties are in the public domain. Researchers are advised to consult the copyright law of the United States (Title 17 USC, 101) which governs the making of photocopies or other reproductions of copyrighted material.
