Summary

This collection contains records regarding Haitian and Cuban migrants and refugees. These records include correspondence, memoranda, reports, briefing and meeting materials, schedules, newspaper articles, and emails.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2011-1039-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. This FOIA contains records from Eric Schwartz, NSC Senior Director for Multilateral and Humanitarian Affairs, regarding Haitian and Cuban migrants/refugees. In early 1993, Clinton officials sought to develop a workable means to end the previous administration's practice of direct return of Haitian boat people. By the spring of 1994, as reports of human rights violations in Haiti increased, President Clinton determined to end to the practice of direct return and begin the screening of boat people. However, large numbers of refugees outstripped the capacity to screen, and soon the Clinton administration adopted a safe haven policy, in which all boat people were given temporary refuge at the Guantanamo Bay Naval Station. This safe haven policy, which also reflected the views of the Department of Justice and the Immigration and Naturalization Service, was formally accepted by senior NSC staff in July 1994. When the political crisis in Haiti abated, the large majority of those migrants who had been at Guantanamo were returned to Haiti. Concurrently, in the summer of 1994, severe economic hardship led to increased efforts by Cubans to depart Cuba by boat. Boat departures escalated throughout August, with thousands leaving each week. The magnitude of the numbers made it clear to Clinton officials that they would need to end the current policy of providing entry for all interdicted Cubans. In response, these Cubans were

diverted to a safe haven, initially at Guantanamo, while others were later moved to Panama. At the same time, the Clinton administration entered negotiations with the Cuban government on a migration agreement. Both countries agreed to a legal migration of 20,000 Cuban citizens a year. Also instituted was a screening procedure for interdicted Cubans, in which those with credible claims to refugee status would be taken to Guantanamo for fuller refugee screening. Those deemed to be refugees would not be returned, but rather resettled in third countries. Third country resettlement was chosen due to the Administration's concern that entry in the U.S. for such boat people would encourage large-scale departures. The majority of records processed in response to this FOIA were found in the emails (either to/from Schwartz) or the Records Management System documents, associated with Schwartz. These records include correspondence, memoranda, reports, briefing and meeting materials, schedules, newspaper articles, and emails regarding Haitian and Cuban migrants/refugees. Subject Files and Staff and Office files also reference Eric Schwartz, but these records are responsive to Cuban and Haitian refugees and migrants in general. The Subject Files in 2011-1039-F primarily contain correspondence from Members of Congress, members of state government, and humanitarian organizations regarding a variety of issues on the Cuban and Haitian refugee situation during the Clinton administration. These issues include the United States government's role in both detaining Cuban refugees and returning these refugees to Cuba, funding issues associated with Cuban refugees, and human rights violations of Cuban refugees. The Subject Files also include correspondence from Members of Congress, local government, humanitarian groups, and individuals regarding solutions to Haitian refugee crisis, the United States judiciary's handling of Haitian refugees, humanitarian relief (including HIV treatment) for Haitian refugees, and the detainment of Haitian refugees at Guantanamo. Form letters addressing such correspondence note the Clinton administration's policy on refugee issues. The Agency Liaison files contain correspondence for, against, and responding to the Coast Guard's treatment of Cuban refugees off the coast of Florida in June 1999. The Counsel's Office file of Marvin Krislov contains a 1994 petition regarding international legal rights of detained Cuban refugees and also United Nation protocols concerning the status of refugees. Charles Ruff's Counsel Office files includes correspondence and talking points concerning Cuban refugee resettlement in Albuquerque, New Mexico in 1997. Stephen Warnath's Domestic Policy Council files contain clippings, correspondence, and talking points primarily concerning migration criteria and also federal funding as related to agreements accepting

Cuban and Haitian refugees in 1994 and 1995. Legislative Affairs files contain correspondence regarding the status of Cuban detainees with children or AIDS. The Public Liaison file includes fact sheets on federal assistance to states with Cuban refugees. The researcher should note that a number of records related to this FOIA case are closed for national security reasons.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas— Clinton Presidential Records: White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject Files; Clinton Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files CF; Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files; Clinton Presidential Records: Automated Records Management System [Email]; and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management System. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. In addition, there are WHORM, WHORM Counsel, WHORM (CL), WHORM (OP), WHORM (Too Late); WHORM (Various Offices); and WHORM (Alpha Project) series. Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
