Summary

This collection consists of records related to the implementation of the "Don't Ask, Don't tell" policy concerning homosexuals serving in the military. The collection contains email and memos between White House Staffers, Department of Defense personnel and members of the National Security Council discussing issues with the implementation of the Don't Ask, Don't Tell policy. This correspondence centers on various court cases, including *McVeigh v. Cohen*, *Cammermeyer v. Perry* and *Able v. U.S.* The records also include communications between the White House and advocacy groups such as the Servicemembers Legal Defense Network (SLDN) concerning allegations of mismanagement in the investigations of alleged military homosexual conduct.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2015-0017-F (Segment 1) are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials. Researchers interested in this topic should also see 2006-0227-F. This collection contains records concerning the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy. During his 1992 Presidential Campaign, Bill Clinton promised that, if he were elected, he would repeal the ban on homosexuals serving openly in the military. Once in office, however, the new President faced stiff opposition from many, including the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Colin Powell, the commandant of the Marine Corps, General Carl Mundy, and the chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, Sam Nunn. On July 19, 1993, President Clinton announced the compromise that became known as "Don't Ask, Don't Tell". The policy ordered the military to stop asking recruits about their sexual orientation, but allowed for a military discharge if a member of the armed forces

stated that he or she is a homosexual or engages in “homosexual conduct”. While Clinton acknowledged in his announcement of the new policy that this was not “a perfect solution”, he did consider it “a major step forward”. This collection contains memos between White House staffers, Department of Defense personnel and members of the National Security Council discussing issues with the implementation of the “Don’t Ask, Don’t Tell” policy. The correspondence in this collection centers on various court cases, including *McVeigh v. Cohen*, *Cammermeyer v. Perry* and *Able v. U.S.* The records also include correspondence between the White House and advocacy groups such as the Servicemembers Legal Defense Network (SLDN) concerning allegations of mismanagement in the investigations of alleged military homosexual conduct. The records span the entire eight years of the Clinton Administration and range from the April 1993 meeting between the President and the Joint Chiefs of Staff about ending the ban on homosexuals openly serving in the military to the July 1999 murder of Army Private First Class Barry Winchell at Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

Records that were responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas— Clinton Presidential Records: White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject Files; Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Cables and Emails. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Alpha file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management from 1993 - 1996 and is a series of documents arranged by name of persons, organizations, or events. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office

files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. FOIA 2015-0017-F includes WHORM records from this subject code: HU010 Human Rights - Equality
