Summary

This collection consists of records concerning Clinton Administration policy and actions regarding American involvement in the Somali civil war. When he took office in 1993, President Clinton inherited the humanitarian crisis in Somalia. Though the administration initially continued the humanitarian and peacekeeping mission of Operation Restore Hope, it pulled out after the deaths of 18 U.S. troops in the Battle of Mogadishu on October 3, 1993 turn public opinion sharply against involvement. The collection includes briefing materials, press materials, correspondence, talking points, reports to Congress, and emails regarding the U.S. presence in Somalia.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2012-0659-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. This FOIA request concerns Clinton Administration policy and actions regarding American involvement in the Somali civil war. In 1969, less than a decade after British and Italian Somaliland unified to form the new nation of Somalia, Mohamed Siad Barre began via coup an authoritarian socialist regime. That government collapsed in 1991, ushering in a period of anarchy and factional fighting. A struggle for control of the government began between two rival clan warlords, Mohamed Farah Aideed and Ali Mahdi Mohamed. After several months of fighting, and heavy civilian casualties, Mohamed and Aideed agreed on a ceasefire, splitting the capital of Mogadishu. In the meantime, an estimated 350,000 Somali civilians suffered disease, famine, and death as a result of the war. In 1992, United States President George H.W. Bush approved humanitarian airlifts of supplies into the nation. Shortly thereafter, the United Nations Security Council attempted to bring the humanitarian crisis under control through Resolutions 733, 746, and 794,

beginning the United Nations Operations in Somalia (UNOSOM I). The U.S.-led Operation Restore Hope, or Unified Task Force (UNITAF) was initiated in December 1992 to lead the enforcement of these resolutions. When he took office in January 1993, President Clinton inherited the humanitarian crisis in Somalia, and continued the mission of Operation Restore Hope. In an effort to end the violence, the warring factions negotiated a ceasefire, the Addis Ababa Agreement, at the Conference on National Reconciliation in Somalia in March 1993. The day before the signing, the U.N. Security Council initiated UNOSOM II to replace UNITAF through Resolution 814. In a departure from previous operations, UNOSOM II had the responsibility of a more active nation-building role in Somalia. The U.S.-led multinational force remained in Somalia in support. The March 1993 ceasefire did not hold. Aideed's faction refused cooperation, and Aideed began ordering his militants to attack UN forces, beginning with an attack on Pakistani troops in June 1993. In response, the United States began targeting Aideed sites in Mogadishu in an attempt to remove the warlord. In perhaps the most well known incident of the war, memorialized in the film Black Hawk Down, Aideed's forces shot down two American black hawk helicopters on October 3, 1993. The ensuing fight and rescue attempt resulted in the deaths of 18 American troops and later became known as the "Battle of Mogadishu." Following the incident, American public opinion turned sharply against the war, and President Clinton announced on October 7 an end to U.S. involvement in Somalia. The United States officially pulled out the following year. The majority of materials processed in the first segment of this FOIA case originate in the White House Staff and Office files. In the Counsel's Office, David Gergen maintained files containing press material and papers regarding Somalia and administration Somalia policy. However, most of the materials responsive to this case are located in the National Security Council (NSC) directorates of African Affairs, Counselor's Office, Defense Policy and Arms Control, Global Issues and Multilateral Affairs, Intelligence Programs, Legal Affairs, Legislative Affairs, Multi-lateral and Humanitarian Affairs, Records Management, Staff Director, and Transnational Threats. These collections contain memoranda, reports, press materials, briefing materials, fact sheets, policy papers, UN Security Council documents, congressional correspondence, talking points, and other records regarding Somalia as well as broader related subjects including foreign assistance, peacekeeping, United Nations financing, the War Powers resolution, and relations with families of those who lost their lives. The records also consist of planning documents for Principals Committee (PC) and Deputies Committee (DC) meetings concerning Somalia, as well as the development of Presidential Review Directive

(PRD) 8 and Presidential Decision Directive (PDD) 6. Also, of special note are several major reports on Somalia in these files, including a 21 January 1993 United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Report, the April 1993 Report to Admiral Howe on the Future of UNOSOM II, and the 13 October 1993 Report to Congress on U.S. Policy in Somalia. Lastly, the researcher should note that Richard Clarke's files in the Transnational Threats Directorate, also contain Bush Administration documents concerning Operation Restore Hope. In addition to the White House Staff and Office Files, records from the NSC Records Management System (RMS) numbered documents have been processed in response to this FOIA request. These records, maintained by the NSC Records Management office, primarily consist of correspondence with Congress and outside groups regarding the conflict in Somalia and the U.S. presence there. Records processed from the Automated Records Management System consist of email correspondence concerning Operation Restore Hope and the Battle of Mogadishu. The email correspondence consists of news briefs compiled by the White House and USIA office of Research and Media Reaction. Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas— Clinton Presidential Records: White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject Files, Clinton Presidential Records: WHORM (CL), Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files; Clinton Presidential Records: Automated Records Management System [Email] and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Records Management System. The White House Office of Records

Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. In addition, there are WHORM (CL). Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. The Automated Records Management System (ARMS) is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential email. The ARMS database is comprised of six sub-series of email records called "buckets." The buckets generally represent a specific White House office. The buckets are titled: NPR for National Performance Review, OPD for Office of Policy Development, POTUS for President of the United States, WHO for White House Office, CEA for Council of Economic Advisers, and Default for emails not associated with an office. The WHO bucket contains email created or received by individual with an Executive Office of the President White House user account not identified as CEA, NPR, or OPD. The Default bucket contains email created or received by unknown or un-recognized email accounts. Email found within the Default bucket often includes email created or received by offices or individuals outside the Executive Office of the President. ARMS emails are arranged by topic, there-under by bucket, and there-under chronologically by creation date.
