## **Summary**

This collection consists of records related to the Clinton Administration's policy toward the Republic of Angola. Specifically, the documents address administration efforts to support an end to the Angolan civil war through interactions with President Eduardo dos Santos and UNITA leader Jonas Savimbi, sanctions against UNITA, support of the Lusaka protocol, and participation in United Nations peacekeeping missions. It contains correspondence, memoranda, reports, and emails between National Security Council staff, particularly in the African Affairs directorate.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The materials in FOIA 2012-0662-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. This collection contains records concerning United States relations with the Republic of Angola during the Clinton Administration. At the time of President Clinton's inauguration in 1993, the civil war between the ruling People's Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA) and the Nation Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA) had been underway for nearly two decades. At that time, President José Eduardo Dos Santos was the MPLA head of state and Dr. Jonas Savimbi led UNITA. The fighting became more intense in 1992 after the Presidential election process, laid out by the 1991 Bicesse accords, broke down. In a response to attacks on the Cabinda oil fields, the United Nations (UN) issued sanctions against UNITA in September 1993 through Security Council Resolution 864. In turn, President Clinton issued Executive Order 12865, clearly indicating the Administration's opposition to UNITA. The next year, the MPLA and UNITA negotiated the Lusaka Protocol, which included a ceasefire and was intended to provide a path for lasting peace. President Clinton sent Special Envoy Paul Hare and the UN sent a

peacekeeping force (UNAVEM III) to help with implementing the agreement. However, continued arms trafficking, funded in part through the illegal diamond trade, on the part of UNITA, and reciprocal attacks from the Angolan government, resulted in the breakdown of the peace process. In 1997, the UN sent an observer mission (MONUA) to assist an attempt at forming the Government of Unity and National Reconciliation (GURN). However, this effort failed and MONUA withdrew in 1999. Angola did not see peace until 2002, when Dr. Savimbi died and the new leadership of UNITA demobilized its military forces. The WHORM Subject files contain correspondence, memoranda, reports and copies of the Executive Orders and Proclamation. The correspondence relates to the Lusaka peace agreement and the United Nations sanctions against UNITA in 1994. The correspondence and memoranda contain congressional correspondence to and from the President regarding the renewal of the President's authority to continue the national emergency declared under Executive Order 12865, Executive Order 13069 (Prohibiting Certain Transactions with Respect to UNITA), Proclamation 7060 (Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Nonimmigrants of Persons Who Are Senior Officials of the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola [UNITA] and Adult Members of Their Immediate Families), and the President's periodic report on the National Emergency with Respect to the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA). In the Staff and Office files one responsive document is located in the files of David Gergen, Counselor to the President. It is a November 5, 1993 memo to President Clinton regarding the status of Angola Peace Talks. However, the most comprehensive collection textual records responsive to this FOIA request is found in the records of the African Affairs directorate of the National Security Council. These records consist of correspondence from members of Congress and non-governmental organizations, reports, memoranda, and papers that address a wide variety of aspects of U.S.-Angola relations. These topics include the recognition of Angola in 1993, the Lusaka accords, United Nations Security Council actions, sanctions against UNITA, and the development of the Bilateral Consultative Commission to support the Government of Angola late in the Administration. Similar record types from the first term are also found in the papers of the Global Issues and Multilateral Affairs directorate. The materials from those files primarily focus on humanitarian aid, UN Security Council actions, and the activities of UNAVEM. In the Intelligence Affairs directorate, George Tenet's file contains memoranda and papers concerning the recognition of Angola in 1993 and the Executive Order from that same year implementing sanctions against UNITA. In

the Legal Advisor directorate, Mary Derosa's files contain background material, UN records, and draft executive orders regarding the implementation of the UNITA sanctions. Similarly, the files originating from the Multilateral and Humanitarian Affairs directorate contain U.N. reports and correspondence on both Angolan humanitarian issues and sanctions implementation. National Security Advisor Samuel Berger's files contain records on a December 1994 trip he, as the then Deputy National Security Advisor, and National Security Advisor Anthony Lake took to war-torn Kuito, Angola. Documents concerning Deputies and Principals Committee meetings, as well as the development of Presidential Review Directive (PRD) 9, are located in the Records Management office files. The files of Staff Director Nancy Soderberg contain memoranda, notes, U.N. materials, and correspondence touching on policy making related to every aspect of Angola relations, including recognition, the Lusaka Protocol, and UNITA sanctions. Transnational Threats director Richard Clarke's file on counterterrorism in Angola, contains papers and memos regarding security assistance, peacekeeping, and UNAVEM. The Automated Records Management System and Tape Restoration Project contain emails from the Executive Office of the President. The emails in this collection concern United States Information Agency foreign media reactions pertaining to the Angolan Civil War, press releases regarding the 1997 Executive Order imposing sanctions on UNITA, and Human Rights Watch material pertaining to Angola. The NSC Email System contains electronic correspondence between NSC staffers. These emails primarily concern the development of policy memoranda regarding Angola as well as regular reports to Congress on UNITA sanctions. There are also many emails concerning the scheduling of interagency working group (IWG) meetings. The NSC Records Management System numbered documents contain duplicates of many of the materials in the Staff and Office files, particularly policy memoranda, reports to Congress, external correspondence, and foreign travel planning documents. The researcher should note that many of the records related to this FOIA case are closed for national security reasons.

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas— Clinton Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files, Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files, Clinton Presidential Records: ARMS Emails, Clinton Presidential Records: TRP Emails, and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management Systems. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. The Automated Records Management System (ARMS) is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential email. The ARMS database is comprised of seven sub-series of email records called "buckets." The buckets generally represent a specific White House office. The buckets are titled: NPR for National Performance Review, OPD for Office of Policy Development, POTUS for President of the United States, WHO for White House Office, CEA for Council of Economic Advisers, NSC for National Security Council, and Default for emails not associated with an office. The NPR bucket contains email created or received by an individual with a National Performance Review (NPR) White House user account. The OPD bucket contains email created or received by an individual with an Office of Policy Development (OPD) White House user account. The POTUS bucket was designated for email created and received by the President of the United States (POTUS). Please note that President Clinton never used his POTUS White House user account to send the few emails he wrote while in office. The WHO bucket contains email created or received by individual with an Executive Office of the President White House user account not identified as CEA, NPR, or OPD. The CEA bucket contains email created or received by an individual with a Council of Economic Advisers (CEA) White House user account. The NSC bucket contains email created or received by an individual with a National Security Council (NSC) user account. The Default bucket contains email created or received

by unknown or un-recognized email accounts. Email found within the Default bucket often includes email created or received by offices or individuals outside the Executive Office of the President. ARMS emails are arranged by topic, there-under by bucket, and there-under chronologically by creation date. The Tape Restoration Project (TRP) is a database consisting of restored emails from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS) from July 1994 through June of 2000. The TRP is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential record email. The TRP database is comprised of the same seven sub-series of email as in ARMS. TRP emails are arranged by topic, there-under by bucket, and there-under chronologically by creation date. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
