Summary

This collection consists of records related to Sandra Kristoff and the War in Kosovo. Sandra Kristoff served as the Director for Asian Affairs for the National Economic Council from 1993 - 1994, then as the Senior Director for Asia-Pacific Economic Affairs in the National Security Council from 1994 - 1995 and in December of 1995, she was confirmed by the US Senate at the ambassadorial rank as the U.S. Coordinator for Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC). This collection consists of emails concerning domestic and international press reaction to the Balkan Crisis; emails concerning talking points for National Security Advisor Sandy Berger, and cables concerning international media coverage of the unfolding humanitarian crisis in Kosovo in the spring and summer of 1998.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2019-0317-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. The majority of these records related to this FOIA case are closed for national security reasons.
