Approximately 2,815 photographs in color and black & white film processed from 35mm negatives.

Summary

The photographs processed in this segment were created from January 11, 1994 through January 13, 1994. The segment contains photographs pertaining to: arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President Clinton, White House Staff and others for the time period processed. Of particular focus is a trip by the President to Czechoslovakia and Russia.

Scope and Content Note

FOIA 2016-0984-F (Segment 3) is a request for all Clinton Administration White House photographs taken from January 1, 1994 through December 31, 1994. The photographs processed in this segment were created from January 11, 1994 through January 13, 1994. The segment contains photographs pertaining to: arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President Clinton, Hillary Rodham Clinton, White House Staff and others for the time period processed. Of particular focus is a trip by the President to Czechoslovakia and Russia. Photographs from January 11, 1994 are as follows: President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at the headquarters of the Commission of the European Union in Brussels, Belgium. The President, Jacques Delors and Prime Minister Andreas Papandreu of Greece participate in a meeting and photo-op. Also conferring with the President includes Dee Dee Myers, Mack McLarty, Tony Lake, Warren Christopher, and David Gergen. President William Jefferson Clinton walks with President Vaclav Havel in Prague, Czechoslovakia. President Clinton and President Havel proceed to the Charles Bridge over the Vltava River. The United States and Czechoslovakian entourages proceed to the Golden Tiger Pub where they

have dinner. President Clinton greets the Kopold family, who hosted him during his first visit to Prague prior to becoming President. Later, the United States and Czechoslovakian entourages proceed to the Reduta Jazz Club. President Clinton plays the saxophone. The President is interviewed at two separate points by Ted Koppel for Nightline and Dan Rather for CBS. Photographs from January 12, 1994 are as follows: President William Jefferson Clinton visits Prague's historic Jewish cemetery. The President is accompanied by Jaroslav Safranek, the cemetery's tour guide. The President visits Pinkas Synagogue (a museum for the Holocaust). Present are Rabbi Sidon of Prague and Tomas Krause. President William Jefferson Clinton attends a privatization business event at K-Mart in Prague. The President participates in a panel discussion with Stephen Hientz, Dr. Richard Salzman, Zdena Homokova, Ivan Moyhla, Thomas Porter, and Sandy Chen. President William Jefferson Clinton greets American and Czech embassy employees at an event at Prague International Airport. President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at the residence of the United States Ambassador Adrian Basora in Prague. The President delivers a statement on behalf of the Visegrad countries outside the Ambassador's residence. Present on the dais include President Michael Kovac of Slovakia, President Lech Walesa of Poland, President Arpad Goncz of Hungary, and President Vaclav Havel of Czechoslovakia. The President proceeds to an event where he greets staff and speaks with members of the United States delegation. The President participates in a working lunch with leaders present at the residence, including President Arpad Goncz of Hungary, Prime Minister Peter Boross of Hungary, Foreign Minister Geza Jeszenszky of Hungary, President Lech Walesa of Poland, Prime Minister Waldemar Pawlak of Poland, Foreign Minister Andrezej Olechowski of Poland, President Michael Kovac of Slovakia, Prime Minister Vadimir Meciar of Slovakia, Foreign Minister Jozef Moravick of Slovakia, President Vaclav Havel of Czechoslovakia, Prime Minister Vaclav Klaus of Czechoslovakia, and Foreign Minister Josef Zieleniec of Czechoslovakia. Later, President Clinton participates in separate bi-lateral meetings with President Walesa, President Kovac, and President Goncz. President William Jefferson Clinton and the United States entourage depart Prague, en route Kiev, Ukraine. The President arrives in Kiev and greets President Leonoid Kravchuk. President Clinton and President Kravchuk make statements regarding United States aid and a nuclear arms agreement. The United States and Ukrainian entourages participate in a bi-lateral meeting and have dinner. Staff members present include Warren Christopher, Mack McLarty, Nicholas Burns, Tony Lake, David Gergen, John Podesta, Rose Gottemoeller, Leon Fuerth, Molly Raiser, Wendy Smith,

Jeremy Rosner, Don Steinberg, and Steve Bachar. President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at the Vnukovo International Airport [Международный аэропорт Внуково] in Moscow, Russia. Ambassador Thomas Pickering greets the President. Photographs from January 13, 1994 are as follows: President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at The Kremlin in Moscow, Russia. The President is greeted by President Boris Yeltsin. President Clinton and President Yeltsin participate in a bi-lateral meeting. Present include Warren Christopher, Mack McLarty, Tony Lake, Lloyd Bentsen, Leon Fuerth, David Gergen, and Nicholas Burns. Following the events, President Clinton and President Yeltsin proceed on a walking tour of the grounds at The Kremlin. President William Jefferson Clinton tours Moscow with Ambassador Thomas Pickering. The President visits various shops and visits a cathedral. Following the events the President attends a reception at Spaso House, the United States Ambassador's residence, in Moscow. The President and Ambassador Pickering address a reception. President William Jefferson Clinton attends dinner hosted by President Boris Yeltsin at Novoya Ogaryova Dacha [Ново-Огарёво].

Processing is done at the Folder/Contact sheet level. While this method maintains folder/contact sheet integrity, it frequently results in the processing of photographs that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.

Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore

records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
