## **Summary**

This collection consists of records related to the Ramsar Convention or Ramsar Treaty. Specific items in this collection include environmental e-newsletters, President Clinton's March 1998 remarks to environmentalists in Botswana, emails preparing for the Botswana speech, and materials preparing for President Clinton's March 2000 speech in Bangladesh. This collection also includes Cabinet weekly reports from Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service news releases, and Multilateral Environmental Agreement (MEA) talking points. This collection only contains emails.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The materials in FOIA 2020-0483-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. The Convention on Wetlands of International Importance, also known as the Ramsar Convention or the Convention on Wetlands, is an intergovernmental treaty that provides the framework for national action and international cooperation for the conservation and wise use of wetlands and their resources. Materials responsive to this FOIA request include emails mentioning the Ramsar Convention or Ramsar Treaty. Specific items include environmental e-newsletters, President Clinton's March 1998 remarks to environmentalists in Botswana, materials preparing for the Botswana speech, and materials preparing for President Clinton's March 2000 speech in Bangladesh. The collection also includes email records of a large number of Clinton's speeches regarding Africa as well as Cabinet weekly reports from Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service news releases, and Multilateral Environmental Agreement (MEA) talking points.

## **System of Arrangement**

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas—Clinton Presidential Records: ARMS Emails, Clinton Presidential Records: TRP Emails, and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management System. The Automated Records Management System (ARMS) is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential email. The ARMS database is comprised of seven sub-series of email records called "buckets." The buckets generally represent a specific White House office. The buckets are titled: NPR for National Performance Review, OPD for Office of Policy Development, POTUS for President of the United States, WHO for White House Office, CEA for Council of Economic Advisers, NSC for National Security Council, and Default for emails not associated with an office. The OPD bucket contains email created or received by an individual with an Office of Policy Development (OPD) White House user account. The WHO bucket contains email created or received by individuals with an Executive Office of the President White House user account not identified as CEA, NPR, or OPD. The Default bucket contains email created or received by unknown or un-recognized email accounts. Email found within the Default bucket often includes email created or received by offices or individuals outside the Executive Office of the President. ARMS email are arranged by topic, there-under by bucket, and there-under chronologically by creation date. The Tape Restoration Project (TRP) is a database consisting of restored emails from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS) from July 1994 through June of 2000. The TRP is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential record email. The TRP database is comprised of the same seven sub-series of email as in ARMS. TRP email are arranged by topic, there-under by bucket, and there-under chronologically by creation date.

## **Access**

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
