Summary

The collection consists of records related to Assistant Secretary of State Phyllis E. Oakley and the crises in the former Yugoslavia. Included is an April 1997 cable from Assistant Secretary Oakley to United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Sadako Ogata regarding the safe return and reintegration of refugees in the former Yugoslavia.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2019-0885-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. This collection contains records regarding Phyllis E. Oakley and the conflicts in the former Yugoslavia between 1996 and 2001. Ms. Oakley served in the Department of State as Assistant Secretary of State for Populations, Refugees and Migration (PRM) from 1994 to 1997 and as Assistant Secretary of State for Intelligence and Research (INR) from 1997 to 1999. After the Clinton Administration, she became an adjunct professor at John Hopkins University. Assistant Secretary Oakley passed away in January 2022. The collection includes an April 1997 cable from Assistant Secretary Oakley to United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees Sadako Ogata regarding the safe return and reintegration of refugees in the former Yugoslavia. Most of the records related to this FOIA case are closed for national security reasons.
