Summary

This collection contains records related to John K. Menzies and the former Yugoslavia. This collection consists of records from the National Security Council's Cable, Email, and Records Management System. They include cables related to humanitarian relief operations in the former Yugoslavia. The collection dates from March 1996 to November 1996.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2019-0930-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. The researcher submitted a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for records related to John K. Menzies and the former Yugoslavia. Specifically, the researcher requested a subject line search using the terms: Kosovo, Kosovo Liberation Army, Macedonia, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Yugoslavia, Serbia, Serbia-Montenegro, NLA, National Liberation Army, Ali Ahmeti, Skopje, Southern Serbia, Presevo Valley, and UCPMB. Records to be opened are from the National Security Council's Cable, Email, and Records Management System. They include cables related to humanitarian relief operations in the former Yugoslavia. The collection dates from March 1996 to November 1996. Ambassador John K. Menzies came to foreign relations from the academic community. He was an assistant to the dean of graduate students at the University of California, Santa Barbara before entering the diplomatic corps. His career began in the early 1970s and Menzies served in Hungary, East Germany, and Bulgaria among other places. During the Clinton administration, Menzies was Acting Deputy Coordinator of East European Assistance at the United States Mission to the United Nations. In October 1994, Menzies took the position of Deputy Chief of Mission in Bosnia-Herzegovina

and rose quickly to Chief of Mission. Menzies was appointed by President Clinton in October 1995 to be U.S. Ambassador to Bosnia-Herzegovina and was credentialed January 7, 1996. He served in this position until December 15, 1996. He retired from foreign service and was the Jennings Randolph Senior Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace for several years before returning to academia. Menzies earned degrees in German and History from the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville and graduate degrees from the University of California, Berkeley. He died in March 2022 at the age of 73.
