## **Summary**

This collection contains records related to Senator Elizabeth Warren. The collection consists of correspondence inviting First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton to participate in one of Warren's class discussions at Harvard Law School, and Elizabeth Warren's article, "The Untenable Case for Repeal of Chapter 11," from the Yale Law Journal, 1992.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The materials in FOIA 2019-0723-F (Segment 2) are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. Elizabeth Warren has served as U.S. senator from Massachusetts since 2013, and is the first woman ever elected to the U.S. Senate from Massachusetts. Prior to her political career, Warren taught law at several universities, including the University of Houston, the University of Texas at Austin, the University of Pennsylvania, and Harvard University, and became one of the foremost scholars on commercial and bankruptcy law. As senator, she has focused on consumer protection measures and economic opportunity; Warren proposed and established the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, and served as chair of the Congressional Oversight Panel of the Troubled Asset Relief Program following the financial crisis of 2007-2008. She unsuccessfully ran for president in the 2020 presidential election. Records in this collection include a letter from Elizabeth Warren inviting First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton to participate in one of her class discussions at Harvard Law School, the reply from the First Lady's Scheduling Office, and three copies of Elizabeth Warren's article, "The Untenable Case for Repeal of Chapter 11," from the Yale Law Journal, 1992.

## **System of Arrangement**

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas—Clinton Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files, and Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Alpha file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management from 1993 – 1996 and is a series of documents arranged by name of persons, organizations, or events. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. In addition, there are WHORM, WHORM Counsel, WHORM (CL), WHORM (OP), WHORM (Too Late); WHORM (Various Offices); and WHORM (Alpha Project) series. Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. FOIA 20019-0723-F (Segment 2) includes WHORM records from these subject codes: PP005-01 First Lady.

## **Access**

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
