Summary

The photographs processed in this segment were created from February 11, 1994, through February 14, 1994. The segment consists of photographs pertaining to arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President Clinton, Hillary Rodham Clinton, White House Staff, and others for the time period processed.

Scope and Content Note

FOIA 2016-0984-F (Segment 13) is a request for all Clinton Administration White House photographs taken from February 11, 1994, through February 14, 1994. The photographs processed in this segment contains photographic events pertaining to arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, White House Staff, and others for the time period processed. Photographs from February 11, 1994, are as follows: Prime Minister Morihiro Hosokawa of Japan arrives at the White House. Prime Minister Hosokawa signs the guest book and talks to Molly Raiser, State Department Chief of Protocol, in the Cabinet Room. President Clinton meets with Prime Minister Hosokawa in the Oval Office. Vice President Al Gore, Secretary Warren Christopher, and Tony Lake are present at the meeting. Prime Minister Hosokawa sits at President Clinton's desk in the Oval Office. President Clinton talks with George Stephanopoulos in the Oval Office. Sandy Berger talks with Laura Tyson, Robert Rubin, and Mickey Kantor in the Outer Oval Office. David Gergen talks on the telephone in the Outer Oval Office. Prime Minister Hosokawa confers with staff in the State Dining Room. President Clinton and Prime Minister Hosokawa participate in press availability in the East Room. President Clinton escorts Prime

Minister Hosokawa to his limousine at the North Portico of the White House. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton flies to Norway with Chelsea Clinton and a U.S. delegation on the flight including: Florence Griffith Joyner, Tom McMillen, Kathy Karpen, David Matthews, Dawn Steel, and Irby Simpkins. Chelsea Clinton jokes with Capricia Marshall, Kelly Craighead, and Lisa Caputo during the flight. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Chelsea Clinton and the U.S. delegation arrive in Oslo, Norway for the Winter Olympics. They are met by U.S. Ambassador Jim Loftus, Barbara Loftus, International Olympic Committee officials, and others. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton participates in a press conference with the U.S. delegation at the airport. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrives at the Nevra Hotel in Lillehammer, Norway. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrives and attends the 1994 Winter Olympics Opening Ceremony including torch lighting and fireworks in Lillehammer. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton participates in an interview with Greg Gumbel of CBS Sports in Lillehammer. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton meets with King Harald and Queen Sonja of Norway at the Lillehammer Hotel in Lillehammer. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton dines in Lillehammer with Chelsea Clinton, Kelly Craighead, Capricia Marshall, Lisa Caputo, and Melanne Verveer. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton attends an informal meet and greet reception hosted by Prime Minister Gro Harlem Brundtland at the Olympic Information Center in Lillehammer. Photographs from February 12, 1994, Continued: President Clinton has breakfast with Japanese Prime Minister Hosokawa and his wife in the Residence Dining Room. President Clinton talks with

President Clinton goes jogging in Hot Springs. Associated Press (AP) photographer Scott Applewhite covering the President's run. President Clinton greets people outside the home of Dick Kelley in Hot Springs. President Clinton greets Sheila Bronfman and talks alone with Kirk Hanlin prior to departing Hot Springs. President Clinton departs the Hot Springs Municipal Airport and travels to Andrews Air Force Base. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton and Chelsea Clinton attend the United States vs. France Ice Hockey game at Haakon Hall in Lillehammer. The First Lady participates in an interview with Dorothy Letterman (Dave Letterman's Mother) at the game. The U.S. delegation accompanies the First Lady at the ice hockey game. Photographs from February 13, 1994, Continued: First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton attends a dinner hosted by the International Olympic Committee and the United States Olympic Committee at the Traaseth Hotel in Lillehammer. The First Lady greets Dr. Harvey Schiller, George Steinbrenner, and others at the dinner. First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton attend the Men's Downhill Skiing event at Kvitfjell in Lillehammer. The First Lady congratulates Tommy Moe on his Gold Medal Olympic victory. Photographs proposed to be released from February 14, 1994, Continued: President Clinton talks in the Red Room with Vice President Al Gore, David Gergen, Roger Altman, Tony Lake, and Secretary Warren Christopher. President Clinton and President Nazarbayev sign a Charter on Bilateral Relations and participate in press availability in the East Room. President Clinton escorts President Nazarbayev to his limousine at the North Portico. President Clinton participated in a live telephone call in the Oval Office to KABC radio station in California regarding earthquake relief. Staff members present for the call include Dee Dee Myers, Tom Epstein, John Emerson, George Stephanopoulos, Christine Heenan, and Kim Hopper. President Clinton talks in the Oval Office to Molly Raiser and Tony Lake. President Clinton receives diplomatic credentials from Ambassador Raymond Christien of Canada in the Oval Office. President Clinton receives diplomatic credentials from Ambassador Muhammad Abdul Ghaffar of the State of Bahrain in the Oval Office. President Clinton receives diplomatic credentials from Ambassador Humayun Kabir of the People's Republic of Bangladesh in the Oval Office. President Clinton receives diplomatic credentials from Ambassador Ana Cristina Sol of the Republic of El Salvador in the Oval Office. Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
