Summary

This collection contains records regarding the Ten Point Coalition, an ecumenical organization founded by a group of Black clergymen in Boston in 1992 to help reduce gang-related violence among at-risk youth. The records include invitations to President and First Lady Clinton to speak at Ten Point Coalition events, scheduling documents, newspaper clippings, and summaries of the organization's mission and ongoing efforts.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2023-0031-F (Seg. 2) are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. The TenPoint Coalition is an ecumenical organization founded by a group of Black clergymen in Boston in 1992. The organization works to reduce gang-related violence by focusing on at-risk youth and partnering with local police and other community organizations. Since its founding, multiple cities across the United States have created their own local chapters. Records found in this collection include invitations to President and First Lady Clinton to speak at TenPoint Coalition events, scheduling documents, newspaper clippings, and summaries of the organization's mission and ongoing efforts.

System of Arrangement

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas—Clinton Presidential Records: White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) Subject Files, and Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Alpha file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management from 1993 - 1996 and is a series of documents arranged by name of persons, organizations, or events. The WHORM Subject file was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. In addition, there are WHORM, WHORM Counsel, WHORM (CL), WHORM (OP), WHORM (Too Late); WHORM (Various Offices); and WHORM (Alpha Project) series. Staff and Office files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and document all levels of administration activity. Staff and Office files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. FOIA 2023-0031-F (Seg. 2) includes WHORM records from these subject codes: IV095 Invitations, 1995 PP005-01 First Lady PU Publications.

Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
