Summary

This collection consists of records related to Guilford Glazer. Guilford Glazer was a prominent American real estate developer and philanthropist. Throughout his life, Glazer was involved with many social and political causes related to the State of Israel, frequently hosted international dignitaries at his home, and maintained many charitable and philanthropic endeavors. This collection contains emails and other electronic records.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2022-0620-F (Segment 2) are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related material. Guilford Glazer was a prominent American real estate developer and philanthropist. Following his Navy service during World War II, he grew the family business, Glazer Steel, into an international supplier of steel and a major fabricator of bridges, dams, industrial plants and steel buildings. Glazer then became involved in real estate development. He developed the first high-rise building in Knoxville, Tennessee, and was hired by the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission to develop a large shopping mall for Oak Ridge, Tennessee. In 1971, Glazer opened the Del Amo Fashion Center in Torrance, California, which was the largest shopping mall in the country at the time. At the height of his success, Glazer owned over 10 million square feet of real estate in fifteen states. Throughout his life, Glazer was involved with many social and political causes related to the State of Israel, frequently hosted international dignitaries at his home, and maintained many charitable and philanthropic endeavors. The business school of Ben-Gurion University of the Negev was renamed the Guilford Glazer Faculty of Business and Management. Nanjing University in China and Pepperdine University in California both opened Diane and

Guilford Glazer Institutes of Jewish Studies following major donations. Materials responsive to this FOIA request include emails and electronic records mentioning Guilford Glazer.

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas— Clinton Presidential Records: (SAS) Automated Records Management System [Email]; Clinton Presidential Records: (SAS) Tape Restoration Project [Email]; Clinton Presidential Records: (SAS) Worker and Visitor Entry System; and Clinton Presidential Records: (SAS) White House Database. The Executive Office of the President (EOP) subsystem of the Electronic Records Archive (ERA) contains electronic records created or received by Clinton Administration officials. These records are stored in Search and Access Sets (SAS) that represent their originating computer program. Search strings are used to locate electronic records responsive to FOIA requests, and responsive assets are placed into Search Results Lists (SRLs). Depending on the complexity of the search, there may be multiple SRLs within each SAS. The Automated Records Management System (ARMS) is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential email. The Tape Restoration Project (TRP) is a database consisting of restored emails from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS) from July 1994 through June of 2000. The TRP is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential email. The electronic Worker and Visitor Entry System (WAVES) is a log of visitors/appointments to the White House and is arranged by name of visitor there-under by date. The White House Database (WHODB) is a database of White House events and individuals that attended those events. The database also includes a log of individuals that received White House greeting correspondence. Data was entered and maintained by the Office of Correspondence, Social Office, and Office of Public Liaison.

Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
