Summary

Scope and Content Note

The material in FOIA 2009-1254-F are a selective, not necessarily all inclusive, body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials. FOIA request 2009-1254-F includes three responsive master tape video recordings from the White House Television Office. President Clinton and Hillary Rodham Clinton deliver remarks on presenting the Arts and Humanities awards at Constitution Hall. President Clinton awards the National Medal of Arts awards to: Irene Diamond, Patron of the Arts; Aretha Franklin, Singer; Michael Graves, Architect; Dr. Jose Polisi, President of the Julliard School; Norman Lear, Television Producer; Rosetta Lenoire, Actress; Harvey Lichtenstein, Brooklyn Academy of Music; Lydia Mendoza, Musician; Odetta, Folk Musician; George Segal, Sculptor; and Maria Tallchief, Ballet Dancer. President Clinton awards the National Medal of Humanities awards to: Patricia Battin, Librarian; Taylor Branch, Author; Jacquelyn Dowd Hall, Southern Oral History Program; Garrison Keillor, Radio Show host; Jim Lehrer, Journalist; John Rawls, Political Philosopher (award accepted by his wife, Margaret Rawls); Steven Spielberg, Movie Producer; and August Wilson, Author. The approximate running time of this event is one hour and eleven minutes.

Processing is done at the Folder/Video tape level.

Access

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 USC 2201) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 USC 552 as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.
