Summary

This collection consists of records related to Asa Hutchinson, Congressman from Arkansas's Third Congressional District. Records in this collection include: email, television and print news transcripts, house proceedings transcripts, impeachment proceedings transcripts, and records of event attendance. Many email concern immigration, environmental, and impeachment issues. The collection includes cables summarizing accounts of visits by a congressional delegation to Peru and Bolivia to observe counternarcotics operations; a summary concerning a diplomatic note sent to U.S. Congressmen from the Lao government; and an Air Force One manifest for a flight from Andrews Air Force Base in Maryland to Little Rock, Arkansas and back on March 4, 1997. The remainder of the collection consists of correspondence from Asa Hutchinson and other members of Congress to President William J. Clinton on various subjects.

Scope and Content Note

The materials in FOIA 2006-0185-F are a selective body of documents responsive to the topic of the FOIA. Researchers should consult the archivist about related materials. Asa Hutchinson, a native of Arkansas, is the brother of former U.S. Senator Tim Hutchinson. Asa Hutchinson graduated from Bob Jones University in 1972. He earned his juris doctor from the University of Arkansas School of Law, Fayetteville in 1975. His work in private practice and as city attorney for the city of Bentonville, Arkansas earned Hutchinson an appointment as United States Attorney for the Western District of Arkansas in 1982. In 1985, Hutchinson resigned as U. S. Attorney to run against incumbent Dale Bumpers for the United States Senate. Hutchinson lost that 1985 campaign and took a position as co-chairman of the Arkansas Republican Party. In 1990, he ran unsuccessfully for Attorney General of

Arkansas. Following the retirement of the very popular Democrat David Pryor, Hutchinson won Pryor's old Congressional seat in the 1996 election. Asa Hutchinson was a member of the 105th, 106th, and 107th Congresses, representing Arkansas's 3rd Congressional District. During his first term Hutchinson served as one of the managers (prosecutors) during President William Jefferson Clinton's Senate impeachment proceedings. While in office Hutchinson served on the House Judiciary Committee, the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, Veteran's Affairs Committee, and the Government Reform Committee. Hutchinson resigned from Congress in August 2001 following his appointment as director of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) under President George W. Bush. After two years as Director of the DEA, Hutchinson was appointed as the first Under Secretary of Homeland Security for Border and Transportation Security in the newly created Department of Homeland Security; serving in this capacity from 2003 to 2005. Hutchinson joined the law firm Venable LLP in 2005. In 2006, Hutchinson unsuccessfully ran as the Republican candidate against Democrat, Mike Beebe for Governor of Arkansas. Following his defeat, Hutchinson returned to the Venable LLP law firm. In 2014, Hutchinson successfully ran as the Republican candidate for Governor of Arkansas defeating Democrat Mike Ross. Clinton Presidential Records relating to Asa Hutchinson consist of Automated Records Management [Email], Tape Restoration Project [Email], NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management Systems, WHORM Subject Files, and White House Staff and Office Files. Automated Records Management System [Email] (ARMS) and Tape Restoration Project [Email] (TRP) e-mail records responsive to this FOIA originate in the Office of the White House (WHO), Office of Policy Development (OPD) and Default e-mails belonging to no specific agency. These e-mails consist primarily of compilations of media stories from the public sphere and multiple-issue mass e-mails circulated to a wide variety of recipients. Electronic mail records found in WHO consist largely of television and print news transcripts, house proceedings transcripts, impeachment proceedings transcripts, and records of event attendance. However there are records relating to appointments to commissions and legislative business. Electronic records from OPD consist primarily of a series of emails regarding immigration, environmental, and impeachment issues. Records responsive to this FOIA were also found in the NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management Systems. The cables contain summarized accounts of visits by a congressional delegation to Peru and Bolivia to observe counternarcotics operations, a summary concerning a diplomatic note sent to U.S. Congressmen from the Lao government and an Air Force One manifest for a flight

from Andrews Air Force Base in Maryland to Little Rock, Arkansas and back on March 4, 1997. The emails contain lists of pending correspondence from the President and National Security Advisor to members of Congress on a variety of subjects.

Documents found from the NSC Records Management consist largely of letters from the President to members of Congress concerning foreign policy issues. Records responsive to this FOIA found in the WHORM Subject Files and the White House Staff and Office Files primarily contain correspondence from Asa Hutchinson and other members of Congress to President William J. Clinton on various subjects.

Records that are responsive to this FOIA request were found in these collection areas—Clinton Presidential Records: WHORM Subject Files; Clinton Presidential Records: White House Staff and Office Files; Clinton Presidential Records: ARMS Emails, Clinton Presidential Records: TRP Emails, and Clinton Presidential Records: NSC Cable, Email, and Records Management Systems. The White House Office of Records Management (WHORM) contains a variety of series created to organize and track documents and correspondence. The WHORM Subject File was compiled by the White House Office of Records Management and is a series of categories designated by a letter/number combination. In addition there are WHORM, WHORM Counsel, WHORM (CL), WHORM (OP), WHORM (Too Late), WHORM (Various Offices), and WHORM Alpha Project series. White House Staff and Office Files were maintained at the folder level by staff members within their individual offices and documents all levels of administrative activity. WHORM files are processed at the document level; whereas, Staff and Office Files are processed at the folder level, that is, individual documents are not selected and removed from a folder for processing. While this method maintains folder integrity, it frequently results in the incidental processing of documents that are not wholly responsive to the subject area. The Automated Records Management System (ARMS) is a database that contains email records of the Executive Office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential Records email. The ARMS dataset is comprised of 6 sub-series of email

records called "Buckets." The buckets include NPR, OPD, POTUS, WHO, CEA, and Default. ARMS emails are arranged chronologically by creation date. The Tape Restoration Project (TRP) is a database consisting of restored emails from the Automated Records Management System from July 1994 through June of 2000. The TRP is a database that contains email records of the Executive office of the President. This system maintained unclassified Presidential record email. The TRP dataset is comprised of 6 sub-series of email records called "Buckets." The buckets include NPR, OPD, POTUS, WHO, CEA, and Default. ARMS emails are arranged chronologically by creation date.
