Commemorating Courage: 40th Anniversary of Desegregation of Central High

This online exhibit revisits the history of the 1957 Central High crisis through select quotes from President Clinton's remarks at the 40th Anniversary Commemoration, an examination of the speechwriting process required to craft these remarks, documents, and images from the archives at the Clinton Presidential Library. The exhibit also provides links to additional historical materials maintained by other institutions.

** The items in **bold** within each framework standard are areas that will be emphasized during the presentation, other areas listed may possibly be addressed.

United States Government Frameworks

- Analyze the division of power and interrelationships between federal and state government
- Analyze major U.S. Supreme Court decisions affecting our understanding of the U.S. Constitution (e.g., Marbury v. Madison, McCullah v. Maryland)
- Explain ways the U.S. Constitution and U.S. Supreme Court decisions have and have not protected civil liberties from governmental intrusion
- Analyze various federal laws, policies, and rulings concerning civil rights of individuals and groups
- Analyze local and national issues addressing fundamental rights of individuals (e.g., civil liberties, due process, equal protection)
