Student Presidential Tour

The Student Presidential Tour is docent-led. The tour includes viewing the permanent exhibits and the current temporary exhibit. The permanent exhibits include replicas of the Cabinet Room and the Oval Office, an eight year Clinton administration timeline, and thematic alcoves that examine specific policy issues in depth. This tour lasts one hour and 15 minutes.

*** The items in **bold** within each framework standard are areas that will be emphasized during the presentation, other areas listed may possibly be addressed.*

United States Government Frameworks

- Examine the composition and roles of the presidential cabinet and federal agencies and continuity and change over time
- Analyze major U.S. Supreme Court decisions affecting our understanding of the U.S. Constitution
- Explain ways the U.S. Constitution and U.S. Supreme Court decisions have and have not protected civil liberties from governmental intrusion
- Analyze various federal laws, policies, and rulings concerning civil rights of individuals and groups
- Analyze local and national issues addressing fundamental rights of individuals (e.g., civil liberties, *due process*, and equal protection)
