Rivlin, Rubin and Rasco agreed this morning that the three of them need to meet ASAP to discuss major budget options on Urban Policy, Infrastructure Bank, ETR and Education Trust Fund. Rivlin has the sense that she knows much more about the substantive state of play on these than Rasco or Rubin do; and that they did not appreciate the budget process-driven timetable for getting to closure. The three agreed that the goal is to get a preliminary decision about level of interest on each of these from POTUS as soon as he returns from the Middle East -- end of next week, or so.

As I write, Rivlin's office is trying to set up a meeting for the three of them plus key staff for sometime SATURDAY.

Bill Halter from OMB may try to talk to you this weekend in New Orleans about the EEOC rule for streamlining the EEO process for federal employees. The basic issue is that we are on the verge of getting the rule finalized and NPR has scheduled, at the PMC meeting on May 5, a discussion to create a non-regulatory process to reduce the federal sector backlog as well. There is the potential for confusion from the agencies that these two processes are happening at the same time. Don Arbuckle's shop at OMB is concerned that because the final stages of the rule making are expected to be contentious, that Morley's process will give the indication that the White House is backing away from the rule (which several agencies such as Treasury do not like). Last year, Sally Katzen made clear that we were behind the rule, and I think Chuck and Maria are as well. In order to keep the rule on track, it seems like we should show strong support for the rule at the PMC meeting.

Subject: EEOC Federal Sector Rule

EEOC has been working on new regulations for over a year which would streamline and make fairer the process by which federal employees pursue discrimination complaints. This process has been a very contentious one with many of the agencies voicing objections. The main issue is that under the current system, the agencies issue a "final decision" from which the employee can appeal. However, EEOC wanted to change this because one of the parties in interest (the agency-defendant) acted as its own judge and jury, making the process seem unfair. Under the proposed rule, the EEOC Administrative Judge (AJ) would issue a decision, and the agency would only have a short period of time to accept or reject it. The final rule is almost ready to be published, barring any last minute objections by the agencies. OMB is planning on asking for final comments from the agencies next week.

NPR is starting a related process which would try to reduce the backlog of federal employees' complaints pending at each agency (in addition to what

the above rule might accomplish). NPR plans on announcing this Task Force at the PMC Meeting on May 5. Moreley really wants to announce the NPR Task Force next week.

The issue is that some of the agencies may view the NPR process as the Administration as backing away from the rule and that the agencies might use the PMC meeting to derail the final rule process. While the final stages of the rule process may be contentious, it might actually be beneficial to voice strong WH support for the rule at the PMC meeting. Thus, the PMC meeting could actually help, rather than hinder, the final stage of the rule process. Does this seem like a good strategy?

Edley asked me to alert you to HUD's interaction with representatives from FL regarding release of CDBG monies for recovery from Tropical Storm Alberto. HUD staff passed along erroneous information that caused much unnecessary confusion. I spoke to Debbie Kilmer, the FL rep in DC; Leslie Wooley, Graham's staffer; and HUD staff today to try and set things right.

Florida has already submitted detailed info to HUD on their housing needs, so we should receive HUD's recommendations by early next week.

Graham's Office. HUD LegAffairs (Beechman) told Wooley that OMB was holding up release of CDBG contingency monies, so she called Edley to encourage an expedited release. Their office is under a lot of pressure to get monies for flood recovery.

I told her OMB had not yet rec'd sufficient information from HUD to justify release of monies. HUD (Katz) sent Edley a brief memo on 9/2 asking for release of all \$180m in CDBG contingency monies due to "extensive damage and long-term" needs. I said we need more specific information than that and outlined some of the criteria we apply (no duplication of Federal effort, existing resources not available, etc.).

Representative Peterson. I have heard that the Congressman has called several WH offices (IGA, Panetta) to complain that OMB is holding up release of funds for FL because we are waiting for GA's request to be submitted. HUD staff acknowledge that they told him as much. They were confused; it is not true. We will review detailed requests from any state as soon as we receive them.

Georgia Reacts. GA officials also called me concerned that FL and TX will 'beat them' to the money. I repeated that OMB will review substantive requests as we receive them, but will release monies judiciously to ensure all appropriate requests from the entire

region are funded. Yesterday, we received a general allocation of GA's needs totalling \$323 million. I expect detailed figures from GA in two weeks, maybe sooner.

Following yesterday's meeting, Karen is having John Podesta call a meeting to review the pay memo and its implementation. Doug is drafting revisions that reflect the military pay language that the Congress is apparently agreeing on.

Assuming for the moment that 3.6% is chosen, the following options for implementation were discussed:

1. Attempt to get Congress to agree to put the 3.6 in statute before the August recess- this would mean that the President would not need to act.
2. Assuming Congress did not act, :
 1. The President in August could begin a two step process:
 1. Allow the 3.1% statutory base pay raise to go into effect automatically and
 1. Say nothing
 2. Call on Congress to implement the statute.
 2. If the Congress did not act by the end of November, add the locality pay component of .5 to the base pay component. This would require a finding that the Statutory increase of more than 12% would cause grave harm.

2. The President could make the above finding and declare the entire 3.6 in effect. We normally consult with the unions on distribution between base and locality the logical split would be 3.1 and .5.

The group that met recommended the two step. As soon as the memo is redrafted, I will reach out to Kitty Higgins and Janice Lachance to have a conversation with them so that they know where we are.

While I am not an expert in Congress, Bill Halter had an excellent observation that Senator Stephens civilian constituents would be disadvantaged if the President put the two part raise into effect. In Alaska, employees do not get locality pay. They get an alternative adjustment. If Congress simply enacted the 3.6 they would get that amount plus the alternative adjustment, If the base is 3.1 they lose .5. This may give him some incentive to act. He could act before the recess or after.

Subject: Olympic Projects That Could be Subject to Scrutiny

Per your request, Kim and I have identified 2 questionable Olympic projects, which we described to you earlier. The descriptions for these projects are as follows:

1) Snow Basin (aka Trappers Loop): The 3-mile road will provide access to a new private ski resort and housing development. The FY99 Omnibus Appropriations Act directs \$15 million of the Federal Highway Administration's Public Lands Forest highway funding, which is normally distributed to States via formula, to this project. This road would not

normally receive Public Lands Forest highway funding because it is not designated as a Forest highway. In addition, the Utah State Transportation Commission and the State Legislature are on record stating that its Federal formula funds will not be used for this project.

2) SLC East-West LRT (Downtown Segment): The FY00 Budget provides \$20 million for the downtown segment of Salt Lake City's 10.9 mile East-West Light Rail Transit (LRT), and states the Department's intention to sign a \$74.8 million Full Funding Grant Agreement (FFGA) for this segment. The East-West LRT would not normally receive a FFGA because, in FY00, the entire 10.9 mile project received a "not recommended" rating based on FTA's project and finance criteria. However, the downtown segment will provide needed transportation for the 2002 Olympics (all ticketholders will be expected to travel to venues and events by transit).

Interior has submitted draft testimony for a April 27th, the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee hearing opposing S2231 and HR2879 -- companion bills that would direct Interior to install a plaque to commemorate Martin Luther King's speech, entitled "I Have A Dream," on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial. Interior opposes the bills because (1) the space should not be reserved for a single occasion no matter how profound, and (2) the precedent created would compel others to seek plaques to commemorate other events. Interior's draft testimony is attached.

During House consideration of HR2879, however, Interior signaled that it supported HR2879 when the bill came to the House floor. (The Administration neither testified nor reported on the bill prior to the floor vote.) In turn, we may or may not have informally communicated that position to the Hill.

Interior claims to have no knowledge of the prior position and has asked that we verify whether OMB, in fact, told the Hill whether the Administration supported the bill. Is there any way to verify what OMB may have communicated to the Hill?

Sen. Coverdell (R-GA) is the sponsor of S2231, and Rep. Northup (R-KY) is sponsor of HR2879. The House passed HR2879 by voice vote.

Mr. Chairman, thank you for the opportunity to appear before you today to present the Department of the Interior's views on S. 2231 and H.R. 2879, similar bills to provide for the placement at the Lincoln Memorial of a plaque commemorating the speech of Martin Luther King, Jr., known as the "I Have a Dream" speech.

The Administration opposes S. 2231 and H.R. 2879.

The Lincoln Memorial stands as a symbol of the unification of the states and the healing of the nation after an enormously significant period in our history. We have consistently rejected proposals that would mark this presidential memorial as the platform for issues or events that have or will occur there. A marker, as simple as it may be, of any design or to any subject or person, can only serve to blur the personal values that each visitor brings to and takes away from the memorial. Dr. King's speech can be fully presented graphically or orally to visitors, and with less disruption, without placement of a plaque on the steps of the memorial. The National Park Service has already placed an exhibit

within the ground level visitor area of the memorial that displays the events that have occurred here.

The experience of this memorial is a carefully designed emotional sequence in which ascending the stairs to the chamber stimulates a strong anticipatory feeling. To distract the visitor from that experience with a marker for any event would severely compromise the design intent of the memorial.

The proposed marker would honor a pivotal speech by Dr. King, which is viewed as the center point of the Civil Rights movement. However, Ms. Marian Anderson's concert also utilized the power of the Lincoln Memorial; on Easter Sunday, April 8, 1939, nearly 25 years before Dr. King, to introduce the movement to end segregation. Dr. King's speeches at this location in 1957, and again in 1963 contributed immensely to the civil rights movement. Dr. King's contribution to American history is recognized now by a national holiday and the pending memorial to "The Man – The Movement – The Mission," at the site on the Tidal Basin.

The proposal to place a plaque at the location of Dr. King's famous speech is not a new concept. It was in fact mentioned as an alternative in the discussions to commemorate Dr. King here in Washington, D.C. The idea was rejected by the sponsors of this memorial, the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, of which Dr. King was a member, because of their strong belief that Dr. King's achievement throughout the civil rights movement was

much more important than the marking of a singular event, however emotionally stirring or profound its impact on the generations of Americans who heard the speech.

The Lincoln Memorial and the figure of Abraham Lincoln is a shrine for all those who desire to capture the hearts and attention of the nation. The monumental space provides the setting to stir emotions about personal sacrifice, such as Mr. Lincoln's, in the preservation of the Union, as well as the sacrifices of the many who fought, died or were injured in the personal pronouncement of their inherent beliefs. The space proposed to be marked has been used by others before, and will, presumably, be used for other unknown and unpredictable events in our future as a nation. It should not be reserved for a single occasion no matter how profound. Further, if this precedent is set, certainly others will seek plaques to commemorate other events.

The National Park Service provided these views to the National Capital Memorial Commission on March 7 when that Commission met to review H.R. 2879. The Commission concurred in these findings and recommended against enactment of this legislation.

That concludes my prepared testimony on S. 2231 and H.R. 2879, and I would be happy to answer any questions you may have.

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Swearing In of Ticket to Work and Work Incentive Improvement Act (TWWIIA) of 1999 Advisory Panel: On July 24, Commissioner Apfel will swear in the 12-member TWWIIA of 1999 Advisory Panel. Sarah Mitchell, Executive Director, New Jersey Protection and Advocacy, Inc., was appointed by the President to Chair the panel. Susan Daniels, SSA's Deputy Commissioner for Disability and Income Security Programs, along with Ken McGill, SSA's Associate Commissioner for Employment Support Programs, will deliver the welcome address at the ceremony. The ceremony, which will be held in Arlington, VA, will be open to the public and broadcast on live webcast. Disability advocates and the public, and White House, congressional, SSA and Health Care Financing Administration staff are expected to attend the ceremony. TWWIIA, signed by the President in December 1999, increases beneficiary choice in obtaining vocational and employment services and provides increased health care coverage for workers with disabilities.

SSA's Seattle Region to Host a Link to the Western Region Community Town Hall Meeting Sponsored by Asian American and Pacific Islanders (AAPI): On July 24, SSA's Seattle Regional Commissioner, Carmen Keller, will host a video conference link site for the Western Region Community Town Hall meeting in SSA's regional office in Seattle, WA. The meeting is sponsored by the President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders and originates in Los Angeles, CA. The daylong event will include about a dozen sites from California to Texas and will involve community leaders and activists.

KEY AGENCY NEWS

Event Marking 65th Anniversary of the Signing of the Social Security Act: On August 5, the Social Security Administration and the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library and Museum are hosting an event on the grounds of the Library in Hyde Park, NY. The event will mark the 65th Anniversary of the signing of the Social Security Act, which occurred on August 14, 1935. The program will include remarks by Commissioner Apfel, James Roosevelt, Jr., grandson of FDR and former Associate Commissioner for Retirement Policy at SSA from 1998 - 1999, and Cynthia Koch, Director of the FDR Library. The program will also include a dramatic reading by a local actor who will play FDR, and will conclude with a reenactment of the signing of the Bill. The public visiting the Library on that day will be invited. It is expected that approximately 500 people will attend the event.

Had a lengthy discussion this evening on the role of the PMC that, as Margaret had forewarned me, got off to a bit of a rocky start because, for different reasons, Bob and Carolyn were a bit troubled by Phil's letter to the PMC.

I walked through the proposed agenda, which gave Stone heartburn for reasons not worth dwelling on here. Carolyn had a very constructive suggestion that we try to interview the PMC to (1) get their ideas for role and future of the PMC; and (2) to build our list of streamlining obstacles. Carolyn thought we could do it if we divided up the names and worked it next week. Yes, Margaret, I know that you had proposed this on Tuesday and some troglodyte said it couldn't be done. To test the concept, we decided to do a trial interview with Walter Broadnax tomorrow. Carolyn called Walter to set it up and got an interesting reaction: he thought it was a great idea to push the question of "whither the PMC" (and he has some strong views) but volunteered that it would work even better if he called a couple of his colleagues and then had each of them call a couple more. Evidently, there has already been a fair amount of cross-talk among the members on how to get the PMC moving. They would then come into the meeting juiced up to talk about how the PMC could work.

That left the rightsizing issue and Walter thought that having Perry lead the discussion would be great. Stone, Lukensmeyer and I will each interview a couple of PMC types to stoke the discussion on obstacles. NPR will also canvass its liaison

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network.

Bob and Carolyn both want to meet with Phil on November 29 or 30 for a pre-brief on the PMC. Margaret: could you get us some time on Phil's calendar?

Stone had a suggestion that - believe it or not - turned my thinking on its head. (No smart comments please!) To keep the members engaged, the appeal has to be, in large measure, that the President needs them involved to oversee the NPR implementation. My thinking had been that we had to convince them that they need the PMC. Something to think about.

Bottom line: We are all happy campers again and working from the script that we had set out for Phil. I clearly need to spend more time with the 750 17th Street crowd to make sure they feel included. What about including Carolyn in our weekly conference call? She is enormously creative and could have gotten us to a better result faster if she had been in this week's session. Bob is going to use her half time and wants to devote her to the PMC.
