Tony:

In addition to our talking points on Rwanda provided for the President's meeting with Boutros Ghali, I'd like to reiterate my suggestion that the President raise with Boutros Ghali the possibility of our contacting foreign governments, especially in Africa, to urge them to provide troops to the Rwandan peacekeeping mission. We understand that Ghana, Ethiopia and Senegal are on-board -- who else does Boutros Ghali think it would be useful for us to contact?

We have checked with all the lawyers, and they agree that the President can use the word, "genocide", to refer to the situation in Rwanda if he wishes. This involves no additional legal obligations beyond what we are doing, and it would be an important indication of our seriousness. Your call.
