A number of prominent private Americans would like to travel to Central Africa to review the relief efforts for the Rwanda refugees. We have deferred these requests until now because we did not want such a group to interfere with more important relief efforts. However, with the situation in the refugee camps in Goma starting to stabilize, the installation of a new government in Rwanda and renewed concerns over instability in Burundi, it would be useful for a group of prominent private Americans to travel to the region on your behalf (see Tab A).

The purpose of the mission would be four-fold:

- It would support our policy of sending high-profile delegations to Bujumbura to shore up Burundi's political stability and to Kigali to reinforce our message that the new government needs to broaden its base, avoid retribution and create conditions for the return of refugees.
- The publicity generated during and after the trip would help enlist continued support and contributions for public and private relief efforts.
- The visit would allow these individuals to see and report back on how we are using American military personnel and tax dollars to save lives.
- The visit would reach out to an important group of Americans to help strengthen the U.S. constituency for Africa.

A seasoned diplomat such as former U.N. Ambassador Don McHenry might serve as head of the delegation and spokesperson in meetings with foreign government officials. For maximum impact and flexibility, the delegation would fly on U.S. military aircraft to Kigali to meet with government officials, UNAMIR forces, the U.N. special representative, private relief agencies and others. The group would then fly into Goma on a relief flight, assuming conditions still permit, where the group would meet with relief agencies, including UNHCR and private groups, and review the relief efforts. We envision a meeting with village elders in the camps who continue to spread ethnic hatred and distrust of the new government in Rwanda. The group would then travel to Bujumbura to convey a strong message to Hutus and Tutsis alike of the need for national

reconciliation and the resolution of the presidential succession issue, lest the tragedy in Rwanda be repeated in Burundi. We would refine the message the party would convey as we get closer to its departure. Upon return, the delegation would meet with you and/or other senior officials to report on their impressions of their travel. We are working with the State Department and DOD on arrangements.

Eric:

I fully agree. I'm going over to see George Moose later this morning to discuss next steps. You should obviously make your views known to Dick and Susan as well.

This is one of the reasons I want the President to be involved with the Monquie session. I've found that on occasion the only way to focus attention of decision-makers is to get them personally involved -- once Monquie describes the horrors of Rwanda to the President and once he is forced to deal head-on with the continuing crisis on a human level, it will potentially lead to a more complete discussion of the what we can do about it.
