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On top of all this, U.S. officials recently received new accusations that Cherubin has been involved in the drug trade. That this was taken seriously is shown by the attempt to block Cherubin's appointment (reported to us by well-placed congressional sources) by Robert Gelbard, assistant secretary of state for international narcotics.

Gelbard was overruled, however, and Cherubin went to Guantanamo. That suggests the United States is not prepared to monitor Aristide's appointments the way it did in El Salvador during that government's long struggle against communist insurgents.

Administration officials describe a "double-key" system under which either side -- the United States or the Haitians -- can veto any prospective policeman. But what about the police chiefs? There, it seems, Washington will not press too hard to exclude people like Cherubin.

Last week, Aristide talked of restoring democracy to Haiti through a "Caesarean operation." To some present, that sounded like a bloody solution. The re-emergence of Pierre Cherubin tends to confirm those suspicions.

CIA Report On Aristide Said to Be Highly Unreliable

CHARLES BIERBAUER, Anchor: U.S. intelligence reports have raised questions about Aristide's mental stability, questions that touched off heated debate on Capitol Hill last week. But as CNN Special Assignment Correspondent Brian Barger reports, there is now evidence suggesting serious flaws in the CIA's investigation.

Sen. JESSE HELMS, (R) North Carolina: (In speech to Senate) This man is a psychopath. And I don't think we have any business whatsoever—

BRIAN BARGER, Investigative Correspondent: Helms made the accusation last week. It came from a classified CIA psychological profile, detailed in Senate briefings, labeling Aristide a "psychotic and manic-depressive." But CNN has learned that the CIA report is based on uncorroborated information, some of it provided by the very military officers who overthrew Aristide two years ago. One U.S. official familiar with the CIA report said the agency relied mostly on an analysis of Aristide's speeches and two uncorroborated sources for its psychological profile.

Sen. HOWARD METZENBAUM, (D) Intelligence Committee: I think that the CIA is beyond its limits of its proper actions basing this man's reputation. I just don't think it's our business.

BARGER: The CIA relied, in part, on this five-page report in French, written by Michel-Ange Momplaisir, a neurosurgeon and university professor who taught Aristide in Haiti in 1977. "I was especially attracted by the tremendous instability of personality of my student," the professor wrote. After consulting with several priests, he added, "My ultimate diagnosis took the direction of psychotic manic-depressive, and I prescribed carbonate of lithium." The report was dated November 8, 1991, one month after the military coup that overthrew Aristide and 18 years after Aristide was in his class. "As a professor," he wrote, "I consider that the superior interests of the state obligate me to produce this report." It was soon delivered to the U.S. embassy. Professor Momplaisir said he knew Aristide was still taking lithium when Aristide returned to Haiti in 1980, because, he said, he discussed the case with a Dr. Harvey Martin (sp?), who, he said, treated Aristide in Canada. "Dr. Martin," he wrote, "taught medicine at the University of Montreal and was a practicing psychiatrist at the Hotel Du Le Montreal Hospital (sp?)." A check with the university and the hospital turned up no record of a Dr. Martin, and Canada's Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons said no such doctor has been licensed to practice medicine in Canada since they began to keep records in 1930. CNN also checked with Canada's medical registry. Again, no Dr. Harvey Martin.

The CIA profile reports the Haitian president was hospitalized in Canada for psychological problems in 1980. But the CIA has not independently verified that report, according

to one U.S. official. President Aristide, a Roman Catholic priest, labeled the report "garbage" and said he was living in Israel in 1980, studying Hebrew.

Sen. METZENBAUM: He was chosen by the people of Haiti, and on that basis, I think that we should not be making psychological evaluations of him.

BARGER: The White House seems to agree, giving little weight to the CIA profile and continuing to back Aristide's return to power. Brian Barger, CNN special assignment.

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HAITI: Draft Talking Points for Congressional Calls

-- We are discussing actively how to address the likelihood that President Aristide will be able to return to Haiti on October 30 as envisioned by the Governors Island agreement.

-- While there has been a delay due to the failure of all parties to live up to the Governors Island accord, we are committed to the process of the Governors Island agreement. We will continue to strongly support the ongoing negotiations in Port-au-Prince under the auspices of the UN/OAS envoy, Dante Caputo.

-- Our tough sanctions policy -- naval enforcement of the UN embargo on oil and targeted sanctions (freezing of assets, denial of visas) -- will maintain pressure on the military to fulfill the pledges they incurred at Governors Island.

-- We are seeking to further tighten the sanctions by encouraging other nations to adopt targeted sanctions as we have.

-- At the same time we will work with President Aristide and Prime Minister Malval to urge them to demonstrate maximum flexibility, and to keep their eyes on our common goal: the restoration of democracy and President Aristide to Haiti.

-- We should look at remaining steps as a package: the police and amnesty laws, Cedras' retirement and Francois' transfer, the end of sanctions and resumption of international aid and Aristide's early return.

-- We are asking President Aristide to center his UNGA speech in New York tomorrow on the theme of political reconciliation and on his continued commitment to a diplomatic solution to the Haitian crisis.

-- We will firmly maintain our policy of the direct return of boat people. We want to avoid a mass exodus of Haitians at great risk to themselves.

-- We will continue to protect poor people in Haiti through our humanitarian assistance programs. Humanitarian goods have been exempted from the embargo. Through our assistance programs over half a million children are being fed every day and health services are being provided to over 2 million Haitians. We will monitor the delivery of these services very closely and seek to assure that their transport vehicles have sufficient fuel.

-- Haiti presents us with a difficult challenge. But American interests are too directly at stake for us to disengage. We must continue to work hard for a negotiated return of democracy to Haiti.

SUBJECT: Delegation to Haitian Presidential Inauguration

The inauguration of the newly elected Haitian President, Rene Preval, will be held on February 7, 1996. The Chief of Protocol has worked with White House offices and the Department of State to develop an appropriate delegation to represent the President at this historic event: Haiti's first peaceful, democratic transfer of power to a new president.

White House offices and the Department of State recommend that the delegation comprise 25-30 persons, including representatives of the Executive Branch, the Congress, state government and the private sector. We request your approval for a 30-person delegation. We list below more than 30 potential delegates so that we will have alternates in case preferred candidates are unable to accept our invitation.

Department of State

o Middle East Peace Process: Israeli and Palestinian negotiators reached tentative agreement March 30th on a package of steps that will establish an international presence in Hebron. The same agreement also paves the way for the early deployment of Palestinian police in Gaza and Jericho and accelerates implementation of the Declaration of Principles. The agreement provides for a temporary international presence in Hebron of 160 observers and support personnel drawn from Norway, Denmark and Italy. By next week, Palestinian police could be deployed in Gaza and Jericho.

o North Korea: We finalized the wording for a statement by the UN Security Council President on the North Korean nuclear issue late March 31st. China accepted virtually all our desired language. The key phrase "further action by the Council" now reads: "further consideration will take place if necessary in order to achieve full implementation of the IAEA-DPRK safeguards agreement."

o Haiti: Aristide will probably not respond positively to Vice President Gore's entreaty and will persist in his demand that the military leadership be removed before he takes any political action. Boutros-Ghali told Ambassador Pezzullo last week that Aristide will never compromise and that we must find a means to end the crippling sanctions.

o Nominations: Senators Biden and Pell have resisted the push by Senator Brown to schedule a second hearing on the nomination of Derek Shearer to be Ambassador to Finland. Biden, however, offered the rarely used option of posing written questions to Shearer. State expects increasingly difficult and partisan confirmation battles as we near the election, including a filibuster on Sam Brown.

o China: State continues to reach out to the Hill in an effort to contain the sense of near-panic that we were heading over the cliff in our relations with China. State believes there is a broad middle group who want to see human rights conditionality, but also hope that MFN will not be terminated.

Department of Defense

o FY95 Budget Resolution: As the House/Senate Conference prepares to convene, the DoD is waging an all out campaign to restore the \$43 billion, five year cut that was sustained in the Senate. These cuts, if not restored, will wreak

havoc on the Bottom-Up-Review. DoD has requested your

personal involvement in the issue.

- o Korea: Ships transporting an Army Patriot Battalion to Korea will depart Oakland, CA on April 3rd and 5th, and are scheduled to arrive in Korea the week of April 17th.

Secretary Perry will visit Korea that week to ensure that we are in synch with the Koreans in our defense planning.

- o NATO Partnership for Peace: Currently it appears we have resolved most of the differences with the French over the European Command structure and on the implementation of PFP. Georgia signed up for PRP on March 23rd and Slovenia became the 14th country to sign up on March 30th.

United Nations

- o El Salvador: Next week the Council may consider a Presidential Statement welcoming the peaceful first round of elections. However, a report of the Secretary-General on the first round will be somewhat critical of voting irregularities and call for these to be addressed before the second round presidential vote, which is scheduled for April 24th. The UN Observer Mission has asked, and the election tribunal has agreed, to continue distribution of voter cards and that voter lists be amended to account for those left off in the first round.

Talbott and Berger have apparently agreed on a recommendation that TL visit Haiti on Thanksgiving to meet with Aristide and eat dinner with U.S. troops. Mike and I leave for the Trilateral in Port-au-Prince tomorrow -- we'll be traveling back on Friday.

When I got involved with the Haitian Chamber starting in January the situation looked like this:

On the one hand, the business elite basically distrusted the Clinton administration and felt it had turned a blind eye toward the abuses of Aristide. On the other hand, the US officials who dealt with Haiti, having historical reasons for not respecting the Haitian business elite, were not inclined to see them as potential contributors to a solution.

In congress, the black caucus (and to a large degree the organized Haitian-American groups) were still hailing as a major joint success their contributions to getting the US to put Aristide back in power. It was (and to some extent still is) difficult for them to acknowledge that Aristide was

ruling by thuggery and had no interest in strengthening democratic institutions. Republicans in congress, were eager to point to the failure of

Clinton's democratic intervention in Haiti, but hadn't seen anything from the

traditional private sector to believe that there might be something that they

could champion in Haiti as a potential counterforce to Aristide.

The strategy we discussed back in January involved having the Chamber take a more proactive role in reaching out to and leading elements of civil society to advocate against violence and pressure for a return to a democratic path. We concluded that if they were willing to do that, and take

the risk, we could bring the black caucus around a bit, interest republicans

in congress, and get USAID to reverse its position of opposition to assistance to the organized business sector.

Starting in January, the Chamber actively pursued this strategy, and the

results were seen on their trip up here in June. My old lefty boss Mark Schneider still wasn't interested in working with the Chamber, but favorable

reactions from McKay, Gillman and Rangle seemed to convince him it was time to give a green light to assistance to the national chamber and other chambers.

With that accomplished I've backed off from my dealings with the chamber,

but I expect I'll be hearing from them again in the future.

Getting the Cuba IWG to approve the assistance proposal for the independent co-ops in Cuba that I prepared is like pulling teeth, as could be

expected. Even though the movement has been developing and expanding for two

years, with considerable information on it available from US and Cuban independent journalist sources, the IWG took the absurd position that they couldn't be certain that what was in the proposal or in all the

journalistic reports was true. And of course they weren't willing to ask USINT to verify or authorize Mutchler to go down. Convenient catch 22. Anyway, we've arranged to have the leader of ANAIC (the umbrella organization) go again to USINT this thursday to answer any questions that the IWG might have and have let Mutchler, Jodi Christiansen and Roger Noriega know that this is scheduled, so they can't claim they didn't have an opportunity.

By the way, does your boss have an interest in weighing in on Cuba stuff?

I know he did when he was in Florida.

Maria,

I've asked Rochelle to reschedule the meeting to discuss MacKay's Disaster Preparedness proposal on a date when Buddy can be there. Today, Buddy spoke with Senator Graham who was very pleased to hear that we'd all be working together toward a conference and the launch of this initiative. We have a call in to James Lee Witt. You may want to add Brady Anderson to your call list, in addition to Peter Romero. As to Mort Halperin, it may be more appropriate to contact Wendy Sherman who has chaired initiatives at State on early warning and on disaster relief.

On Haiti, the situation has continued to change and we've been coordinating closely with Arturo, Don Steinberg, and Luis Lauredo. Arturo reported that, in their second meeting, Aristide showed some understanding of the gravity of the situation and the international concern. As I told you yesterday, MacKay had a very good and productive meeting with the Caribbean Ambassadors (most of them are also the Ambassadors to the OAS) in which he conveyed our desire to consult with them, dispelled the rumor that the US was conspiring to force a 1080 resolution against Haiti at the OAS, and impressed upon them the opportunity for the Caribbean nations to help resolve this issue.

In contrast, today the Financial Times and other press reports stated that the US is seeking to expell Haiti from the OAS. This afternoon, we spoke to Caribbean Ambassadors who were upset by what they recognized was misinformation in the reporting and said they were contacting news media and their government to inform them that this was false reporting. The Caribbean nations indicated they intend to send a fact-finding mission to Haiti. This was the primary reason NOT to travel there, so that our visit would not be perceived as forcing the Caribbeans to send a mission to Haiti, and instead allow them to show clearly their own initiative and leadership. Friday MacKay and Arturo will call several of the key Prime Ministers to underscore the importance of a timely (immediate) Caribbean mission to inform the debate on this issue. We've also spoken to several Senators and Members of Congress, and key staff, to inform them of our action and try to slow down a Republican assault.

I'll be traveling with Buddy next week and will call to set up a meeting with you when I return. Thanks for your help on these issues.

SUBJECT: FOREIGN AND SECURITY POLICY INITIATIVE

I. SUMMARY: Media coverage over the last few weeks has been overwhelmingly critical of U.S. foreign and security policies. Only clear and coherent statements of national interest and policy objectives by all key, senior administration officials can turn this situation around. Absent this, the POTUS risks entering a round of key international negotiations from a position of domestic weakness.

II. DISCUSSION: Several "October surprises" -- Yeltsin's White House siege, Army Rangers slain in Somalia, USS Harlan County snubbed by Haitian thugs -- have turned the nation's attention away from Health Care and RIGO, and focused attention upon the status of foreign and security policy. Warranted, or not, the critical eye of the media focuses where there is weakness.

When the media questioned our backing Boris Yeltsin, our clear support for his stewardship over a process of democratic reform in Russia and the POTUS' masterful lobbying of the G-7 leaders for early and clear statements of support did much to defuse the issue. On Bosnia, Haiti and Somalia, however, no clear articulation of policy nor objectives was forthcoming. Rather, at one point the Secretaries of State and Defense, the UN Ambassador, our Special Envoy(s), and the National Security Advisor expressed slightly different views of U.S. foreign or security policy. To this date, the messages still conflict. For example, as the administration sought to de-personalize support for the leadership in Haiti, the VPOTUS made a strong pitch for Mr. Aristide while entrapped in a discussion of CIA reports on the mental stability of President Aristide. He was cut-off before clearly stating the current or future policy objectives in that Nation.

A lack of clear, coherent, and repetitive statements of policy objectives has had a domestic spillover effect. NAFTA appears threatened by an isolationist sentiment fanned by the foreign policy conundrum. The POTUS risks a visit to the APEC Conference with a NAFTA defeat, followed by a Russia/East-Central Europe visit with simmering problems in the U.S.'s "Near-Abroad," Haiti. A new strategy is needed to quickly regain the domestic initiative: We must clearly, coherently and forcefully state our present and future foreign and security policy objectives -- and relate these to domestic security initiatives such as NAFTA and the Crime Bill. I am sure that I have stated the obvious here, however, would be happy to visit with you on this situation, your schedule permitting.

Barbro:

As you have probably already heard through your channels... ARA is already whining about the Friday, March 5 due dates for the Aristide papers. When I finally got Andy Sens to come clean, he admitted that they could have most of the background information ready but a couple of the papers (like the status of the UN/OAS negotiations) would have to wait until a bit later so that the most current information would be ready. He WANTED to get us the final papers on March 12 but I told him that if he did so, they would not make the President's book (since Tony Lake's deadline is before then).

We finally settled that he would get us all but those that simply had to wait until the last minute (in consultation with you) and that we would have the final one or two papers early next week. So we should have the bulk on Friday with a couple of holdovers. I told Andy to keep both you and I posted on where they stood as we approached the end of the week. Let me know if you get any grief from them and I'll be happy to play the heavy.

Andy also says, which I suspect you know, that ARA will produce a Sec-Pres memo for the Aristide visit (which they don't have to do since its only a short visit and doesn't include a meal or the longer meeting times that Mitterrand or Major had). The policy here is that if the Secretary of State wants to send a memo on a visit to the President, we will see that it gets into the briefing book.

PRESS STRATEGY FOR RADIO ARISTIDE

First, let me state the obvious: anything Aristide says on radio to Haiti "can and will be used against him" and, on the flip side, "can and will use used for him" all around the world--not just in Haiti. Reporters here will analyze what he says carefully--and depending on how he comports himself--the perception of Father Aristide will either be changed or confirmed. Hence, we should have some input, I would hope--even if we have no editorial control over his material--into what he says and how he says it. I can envision a situation in which everytime Aristide says something, we get asked--is this US policy?

There needs to be some way of coordinating, from a media/public affairs side, with Aristide's people. They might do well to meet with our media side at some point. Is he going to give interviews as well? Is he going to be on the radio talk show circuit here? Should he be?

As for our side, we need to talk through WHAT LEVEL OF POSTURE we want to take on this. WHAT'S IN IT FOR US? Do we want to tout this as an arm of our policy? What do we realistically think can be achieved--is there a history of success with this kind of strategy. We want to be in a position to clearly announce the radio policy and explain it. We also need to make sure that we know, in advance, when he is broadcasting and what the upcoming themes will be so that we are not reacting constantly to the latest Aristide message.
