SUBJECT: DDCI REQUEST FOR PFIAB REVIEW OF AGENCY
ACCOUNTABILITY BOARD REPORT

On February 7, 2000, I received a request from the Deputy Director of Central Intelligence, General John Gordon, for the PFIAB to undertake a review of "the results, findings and recommendations of the Agency Accountability Board related to the Inspector General's investigation of improper handling of classified information" by former DCI John Deutch. In his letter to me, General Gordon explained that, while he recognizes such a request to the Board is unusual, he nonetheless believes it is warranted given the unprecedented nature of the Deutch case. The General asked that we accomplish this review as soon as practicable, but that it be done carefully and thoroughly. (U//FOUO)

Executive Order 12863, which governs the operations of the PFIAB, authorizes the Board to consider and recommend appropriate action concerning requests of this kind when our advice "will further the effectiveness of the national intelligence effort." We believe our advice can satisfy this objective. (U)

Therefore, unless you or the President have objections, I plan to respond as expeditiously as practical to General Gordon's request. I plan to create a special sub-panel of the PFIAB to conduct the review and prepare a written report. Besides myself, I plan to appoint PFIAB members Ms. Ann Caracristi, Mr. Stephen Friedman and Mr. Harold Pote to that sub-panel. I expect the review will require 3-4 weeks for completion. (U//FOUO)

Nancy:

We typically do not intrude upon PFIAB's deliberations, nor do we request lists of individuals appearing in front of the Board. We derive great benefit from the Board's independence. With regard to whether Tony Lake clears talking points -- your call -- but I believe Martin should be allowed to express his views freely. His insights into his region -- and his perception of the quality of the intelligence he receives -- should be allowed to flow quite naturally. The Board derives great benefit from such interplay.

Finally, I will talk to Les Aspin about a more direct role for myself in observing and participating in the PFIAB process.
