Stanley Shuman, whose resume is attached, was extraordinarily helpful to the President starting early on in the primary campaign, both politically and as a very substantial fundraiser. He is apparently very interested in an appointment on the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board ("Board") or on the Commission on the Role and Purposes of U.S. Intelligence ("Commission"), both of which, I understand, are headed by Les Aspin.

Mr. Shuman has continued to be very helpful to the President since the election. I strongly urge that he be given every possible consideration for one of these positions.

- (3) process of consultation prior to designation.
- (4) Amendment to E.O.

The E.O. establishing PFIAB states that "The President shall establish the terms of the members upon their appointment. To the extent practicable, one-third of the PFIAB at any one time shall be comprised of members whose term of service does not exceed two years." This is, of course, guidance from the President, ultimately to the President. Bottom line: All members serve at the pleasure of the President for as long as the President desires.

As noted below, there appear to be two likely vacancies to fill in the near term, with a possible third, as Stanley Shuman's term is also up in July, although he

has expressed interest in continuing on. There may be other near term vacancies as well should members move on to other tasks.
