SUBJECT: Call to Director Freeh

During our meeting with Deputy AG Gorelik last Thursday, Jamie said that FBI Director Freeh had discussed the handling of the Marzook extradition with Jordanian officials in his recent trip to the Middle East, and with Arafat during Arafat's visit here. Jamie said that she was "appalled" that Freeh had done so without advance coordination. She said Freeh claimed he had coordinated with you, a point Jim Steinberg dismissed. Jamie said Freeh will only discontinue his unilateral sojourns into foreign policy if he hears firmly from you that such communications must be carefully and thoroughly coordinated in advance. She also mentioned that DOJ still has not gotten a read-out from the FBI on the substance of Freeh's conversations with foreign officials on the Marzook matter. (We saw press pieces from Jordan on such contacts and dismissed them as fabricated, not imagining that Freeh would be holding discussions on Marzook.)

Freeh could counter-complain that the FBI has been cut-out of deliberations over Marzook, notwithstanding the heavy counterterrorism equities. For example, the matter has not been handled in the CSG, notwithstanding FBI's request for a CSG meeting on Marzook. As you know, we have chosen to handle the matter more discreetly, assuming (and wanting) FBI input but through DOJ. In any case, direct, uncoordinated communications by the FBI on sensitive policy matters with foreign governments is unacceptable.

RECOMMENDATION

That you call Director Freeh to (1) tell him discussions with foreign officials on sensitive matters need to be coordinated in advance, and (2) ask him to provide us a briefing on the discussions.

- Jamie Gorelik mentioned to us the other day that you had discussions with Jordanian officials and with Arafat about the Marzook extradition case.
- The Marzook case is not just a law enforcement case. How it is handled could have a dramatic effect on the peace process. The case has had the personal attention of Secretary Albright and me.
- I can't emphasize enough the need for any discussions on it to be coordinated with us and the State Department in advance. The Arabs and Israelis are expert at reading nuance and looking for differences in how USG officials address a matter.
- Also, I understand that no one here has received a readout on your discussions of this matter in Jordan and with Arafat. Please arrange for someone on your staff to be in touch with Alan Kreczko to give us a read-out.
- (If Freeh complains that FBI has been cut-out of decision-making on Marzook): We have had to handle this matter very discretely, given its obvious sensitivities. For this reason, we have not handled it in the normal CSG process. However, in working through DOJ, we assumed (and wanted) FBI input.
