SUBJECT: Surgeon General's request to see the President

---

Surgeon General Elders called Friday to request thirty minutes on the President's schedule. I understand she wants generally to hear how much of an asset (or liability) he perceives her to be. She doesn't want to see other members of the staff.

This is a sticky issue. If we agree to the meeting, we need to prepare for it. That entails a discussion of the upsides and downsides of her agenda. It may be possible to create a positive, helpful agenda for her in the new political climate -- perhaps focussing primarily on ending teen pregnancy. We could put something like that together for the President to discuss with her.

If we don't agree to the meeting, she is as likely as not to tell the press she is unable to see the President. (She has done that in the past.)

I have not communicated this information to other staff.

Recommendation: We call her back and tell her the President's schedule is very busy but we will try to work this in in December. You then convene a discussion with a handful of senior staff regarding what should happen at the meeting.

Please let me know how you would like to proceed.
