I. PURPOSE

Photo opportunity with Rep. Louis Stokes (D-OH) and Mayor David Lynch of Euclid, Ohio.

II. BACKGROUND

Rep. Stokes is the Chairman of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on VA, HUD, and Independent Agencies. He has been very helpful to the Administration throughout the Appropriations process.

Last week when Rep. Stokes was on his way into the White House for a meeting with the Vice President, he encountered a problem with the Secret Service officers at the Southwest Gate. Rep. Stokes was asked for identification, although his white driver was not. Furthermore, before Rep. Stokes was allowed in the gate, a K-9 detail searched his car. Rep. Stokes is understandably furious and believes the search to be racially motivated.

For your information, Howard Paster has spoken at length with David Watkins about the incident. David has taken steps to insure that in the future Members of Congress driving into the White House will be admitted expeditiously and will be treated with respect.
