Mr. Hume: Hello? (U)

The President: John? (U)

Mr. Hume: Yes, Mr. President, how are you doing? (U)

The President: I just called to say congratulations. I
couldn't be happier for anyone. It's wonderful. (U)

Mr. Hume: Thank you. I appreciate it very much. I've just
done PBS and am about to do CNN. Thanks to the people of
America for giving us yourself as President for the outstanding
work you've done for peace in our country. (U)

The President: Well, I've loved every day of it. I was just
ecstatic today. I'm so happy for you. (U)

Mr. Hume: I appreciate your calling me. And all the best to
yourself. (U)

The President: Me, too. I'll stay on top of it here. If you
need me to do anything, let me know. (U)

Mr. Hume: All the best, Mr. President. God bless and thank
you. (U)

The President: Goodbye. (U)
