- Kashmir has been contained. Though festering throughout the first term, the Kashmir conflict did not expand and envelop the broader Indo-Pakistani relationship. (S)
- U.S. trade and investment have expanded: U.S. trade and investment in both India and Pakistan have grown substantially in recent years, with high tech and infrastructure development particularly promising areas. (S)
- There are some positive social/economic trend lines: These include democracy building, continued economic and trade liberalization and, to a lesser extent, the strengthening of human rights practices, although child labor issues and Kashmir are glaring exceptions. (S)

We also, however, face a number of risks and vulnerabilities. For example, we have not convinced India or Pakistan to join the NPT or CTBT, or begin negotiations on the FMCT. Thus, both countries remain outside the non-proliferation treaty frameworks.
