



BACKGROUND

U.S. interests in South Asia include:

--avoiding a war in that region which could escalate to a nuclear exchange; (S)

--preventing the export of WMD technology from South Asia to third countries; (S)

--continuing to open the Indian (and Pakistani) markets to U.S. trade and investment; (S)

--demonstrating (in the case of Pakistan) that we can have a positive relationship with a democratic Islamic country; (S)

--being able to use that region as a gateway to Central Asia and its energy resources; and to support the Central Asia countries' development as sovereign, independent states; (S)

--encouraging environmentally-responsible economic growth and sustained development; and

--encouraging the development of democratic, market-oriented countries along the entire Chinese perimeter as a means helping to positively influence developments in China in the future. (S)

To advance our South Asian interests during the first term, we pursued policy objectives composed of several elements: (S)

EO 13526 1.4c, EO 13526 1.4d

- establishing relationships with India and Pakistan that are defined in terms of their own individual merits and which reflect the full weight and range of U.S. strategic, political and economic interests in each country. We have tried -- with varying degrees of success -- to move beyond the "zero sum" relationship that characterized our relations with these states during the Cold War. Thus, we have sought to engage

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India as a democratic partner on regional and extra-regional issues and as a "big emerging market." With Pakistan, we [redacted] try to place that relationship on a firmer footing, despite long-standing differences on non-proliferation. [redacted] EO 13526 1.4c, EO 13526 1.4d

- encouraging economic and commercial investment and development throughout the region; (S)
- pushing for a resumption of the Indo-Pakistani dialogue. (S)

The policy has had success:

- [redacted] EO 13526 1.4c, EO 13526 1.4d
- Kashmir has been contained: Though festering throughout the first term, the Kashmir conflict did not expand and envelop the broader Indo-Pakistani relationship. (S)
- U.S. trade and investment have expanded: U.S. trade and investment in both India and Pakistan have grown substantially in recent years, with high tech and infrastructure development particularly promising areas. (S)
- There are some positive social/economic trend lines: these include democracy building, continued economic and trade liberalization and, to a lesser extent, the strengthening of human rights practices, although child labor issues and Kashmir are glaring exceptions. (S)

We also, however, face a number of risks and vulnerabilities. For example, we have not convinced India or Pakistan to join the NPT or CTBT, or begin negotiations on the FMCT. Thus, both countries remain outside the nonproliferation treaty frameworks.

--continuing to open the Indian (and Pakistani) markets to U.S. trade and investment; (S)

--demonstrating (in the case of Pakistan) that we can have a positive relationship with a democratic Islamic country; (S)

--being able to use that region as a gateway to Central Asia and its energy resources; and to support the Central Asia countries' development as sovereign, independent states; (S)

--encouraging environmentally-responsible economic growth and sustained development; and

--encouraging the development of democratic, market-oriented countries along the entire Chinese perimeter as a means helping to positively influence developments in China in the future. (S)

To advance our South Asian interests during the first term, we pursued policy objectives composed of several elements: (S)

- establishing relationships with India and Pakistan that are defined in terms of their own individual merits and which reflect the full weight and range of U.S. strategic, political and economic interests in each country. We have tried -- with varying degrees of success -- to move beyond the "zero sum" relationship that characterized our relations with these states during the Cold War. Thus, we have sought to engage

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India as a democratic partner on regional and extra-regional issues and as a "big emerging market." - encouraging economic and commercial investment and development throughout the region; (S)
- pushing for a resumption of the Indo-Pakistani dialogue. (S)

The policy has had success:

- Kashmir has been contained: Though festering throughout the first term, the Kashmir conflict did not expand and envelop the broader Indo-Pakistani relationship. (S)
- U.S. trade and investment have expanded: U.S. trade and investment in both India and Pakistan have grown substantially in recent years, with high tech and infrastructure development particularly promising areas. (S)
- There are some positive social/economic trend lines: these include democracy building, continued economic and trade liberalization and, to a lesser extent, the strengthening of human rights practices, although child labor issues and Kashmir are glaring exceptions. (S)

We also, however, face a number of risks and vulnerabilities. For example, we have not convinced India or Pakistan to join the NPT or CTBT, or begin negotiations on the FMCT. Thus, both countries remain outside the nonproliferation treaty frameworks.

Summary of Conclusions

1. With regard to our general policy approach to South Asia:

- There have been a number of positive developments in our relationships in South Asia in recent years, particularly with India where economic relations have expanded considerably and with both India and Pakistan in the creation of joint consultation groups on security issues. (S)
- These positive developments are counterbalanced by continuing negative proliferation trends, EO 13526 1.4c, EO 13526 1.4d
- The "five basket" policy approach identified in the Discussion Paper offers a pathway for building on recent positive developments and structuring our future relations with India and Pakistan. These baskets include encouraging the Indo-Pakistani dialogue, containing proliferation, expanding economic interaction and relations, developing conventional security cooperation and strengthening programs of sustainable development. Agencies should implement action items in the baskets accordingly. (S)
- A primary goal of the "five basket" policy approach is to encourage further stabilization of Indo-Pakistani relations and, thereby, advance one of our major policy objectives: avoiding a war between these two countries that could escalate to a nuclear exchange. (S)
- Nonetheless, there was acknowledgment of (inherent) tensions between our nonproliferation goals and interests and our broader political, economic and geo-strategic interests. In general, most deputies believe that this gap can best be bridged by pursuing a policy of "soft linkage," e.g., by maintaining current proliferation restraints and establishing the basis for achieving long-term nonproliferation and arms control objectives, while simultaneously improving other areas in the relationship that can provide incentives for improvement on nonproliferation. Moreover, Deputies did not agree on our response to particular proliferation developments in terms of implications for broader bilateral relations. (S)

2. With regard to:

- **A Washington Visit by the Indian Foreign Minister:** We should go ahead with the visit as soon as the Indians are prepared. Illustrative talking points provided in the Discussion Paper for Secretary Albright's use during the visit will be further reviewed and refined. (S)
- **Albright Visit to South Asia:** In principle, Secretary Albright should visit South Asia during this year's 50th independence anniversary celebrations. Further work needs to be done on the design of the trip. (S)


