

II. BACKGROUND

Blair arrives following his regular appearance at Parliamentary question hour, and will come directly from Andrews to your meeting. He leaves for Chicago at noon on Thursday. He wants to use this pre-summit meeting to work through with you the issues he raised in the paper he sent over the weekend, i.e. how to make the best use of the Summit to sustain Allied solidarity over Kosovo.

You agreed that it was worth exploring meeting individually with each of the Alliance leaders to ensure that they are solidly on board for key Summit objectives on Kosovo:

- confirm determination to sustain air strikes
- prevent compromise on NATO's basic conditions
- allow NATO to proceed with updating assessment on ground troops while avoiding divisive debate during summit

Kosovo. In keeping with your recent conversations, Blair has waged an aggressive public campaign to put the message out that NATO will persist with its air campaign to achieve its objectives, keeping all options, including the use of ground troops, under review. He told CBS Monday that in the longer term we have to ensure that Milosevic is not allowed to terrorize this region any more. British support has been particularly strong throughout the NATO operation.

Economic Pressure. Based on your conversations with Blair, the UK has also been active in looking for additional ways to put pressure on Milosevic. The UK instructed its embassy in Cyprus to join a demarche with ours in seeking to close down offshore accounts used by Milosevic. The UK has also been pressing the EU to tighten its implementation of the investment ban and assets freeze directed against the FRY and to adopt a travel ban on senior FRY officials and businessmen with ties to the regime. Finally, the UK has supported our proposal that NATO implement a maritime inspection regime to prevent delivery to the FRY of war material including petroleum products.

Southeastern European Initiative. As you discussed with Blair Saturday, we seek to use the Summit to launch an initiative aimed at transforming southeastern Europe from the continent's primary source of instability to a region with a realistic prospect of joining the Euro-Atlantic mainstream. To achieve this, we need to involve the United States, NATO, the EU, OSCE, international financial institutions and the states in the region themselves. hope to build on existing frameworks, including especially our own Southeast European Cooperative Initiative (SECI), the EU's "Royaumont" process for regional cooperation, and regularized consultations among Southeast European Defense Ministers (SEDM). The Europeans agree with us that we cannot deal effectively with Kosovo except in this wider E.O. 12958 context, and they are discussing similar or related 1.4(b) proposals, including an eight-point plan the (b)(1)Foreign Office has put forward. The (b)(1) are also 1.4(d) putting forward an initiative. We want to announce during the NATO Summit that the Alliance, the EU, and others are undertaking a joint initiative in this area.



NATO Summit. For the most part, they are also on board for the Summit deliverables we plan. ESDI, however, is not resolved. We and the British largely agree on the need for strengthening European capabilities in ways that are compatible with NATO but they have not pressed back as hard as we would wish against French attempts to emphasize EU autonomy and build ESDI outside the Alliance.  - Meet SACEUR's requests for additional forces.

- Be ready to persist for months if necessary.
- NATO must prevail. Anything less than our conditions will undercut long-term regional stability.
- NATO cannot waiver on basic conditions: Serb forces out; international security presence in; refugees back.

He wants to use this pre-summit meeting to work through with you the issues he raised in the paper he sent over the weelend, i.e. how to make the best use of the Summit to justain Allied solidarity over Kosovo.

You agreed that it was worth exploring meeting individually with each of the Alliance leaders to ensure that they are solidly on board for our Summit objectives on Kosovo:

(i) a clear re-affirmation of NATO's conditions -- Serbian forces out, an international force in, and refugees back home; (ii) a signal that military, economic and political pressure against Belgrade will intensify until those goals are met; and (iii) a commitment to do for southeastern

Europe what we helped do for western Europe after World War II and for sentral Europe after the Cold War -- supporting the democratic and economic development of the region, and providing confidence in its long-term security. A proposed set of talking points for these meetings is at Tab B.

British domestic context. Blair is enjoying strong domestic support for his actions on Kosovo, and he appreciated the boost that resolution of the cashmere question gave to his growing lead in the Scottish elections May 6. Only Northern Ireland continues to challenge his political leadership at home. This summer Blair is expected to make some changes in his cabinet; he would like to bring Mo Mowlam back from Belfast to take the Labor party chair or another key position commensurate with her abilities.

Kosovo. In keeping with your fecent conversations, Blair has waged an aggressive public campaign to put the message out that NATO will persist with its air campaign to achieve its objectives, keeping all options, including the use of ground troops, under review. He told CBS Monday that in the longer term we have to ensure that Milosevic is not allowed to terrorize this region any more. British support has been particularly strong throughout the NATO operation. This reflects both Blair's own outstanding public diplomacy efforts and his team's good work in making the case to the British people.

Economic Pressure. Based on your conversations with Blair, the UK has also been active in looking for additional ways to put pressure on Milosevic. The UK instructed its embassy in Cyprus to join a demarche with ours in seeking to close down offshore accounts used by Milosevic. The UK has also been pressing the EU to tighten its implementation of the investment ban and assets freeze directed against the FRY and to adopt a travel ban on senior FRY officials and businessmen with ties to the regime. Finally, the UK has supported our proposal that NATO implement a maritime inspection regime to prevent delivery to the FRY of war material including petroleum products.

Southeastern European Initiative. As you discussed with Blair Saturday, we seek to use the Summit to launch an initiative aimed at transforming southeastern Europe from the continent's primary source of instability to a region with a realistic prospect of joining the Euro-Atlantic

mainstream. To achieve this, we need to involve the United States, NATO, the EU, OSCE, international financial institutions and the states in the region themselves. hope to build on existing frameworks, including especially our own Southeast European Cooperative Initiative (SECI), the EU's "Royaumont" process for regional cooperation, and regularized consultations among Southeast European Defense Ministers (SEDM). The Europeans agree with us that we cannot deal effectively with Kosovo except in whis wider context, and they are discussing similar or pelated proposals, including an eight-point plan the (b)(1) 1.4(b) Foreign Office has put forward. The (b)(1) are also putting forward an initiative. We want to announce during the NATO Summit that the Alliance, the EU, and others are undertaking a joint initiative in this area. Kosovo. In keeping with your recent conversations, Blair has waged an aggressive public campaign to put the message out that NATO will persist with its air campaign to achieve its objectives, keeping all options, including the use of ground troops, under review. He told CBS Monday that in the longer term we have to ensure that Milosevic is not allowed to terrorize this region any more. British support has been particularly strong throughout the NATO operation. This reflects both Blair's computationing public diplomacy efforts and his team's good work in making the case to the British people.

Economic Pressure. Based on your conversations with Blair, the UK has also been active in looking for additional ways to put pressure on Milosevic. The UK instructed its embassy in Cyprus to join a demarche with oars in seeking to close down offshore accounts used by Milosevic. The UK has also been pressing the EU to tighten its implementation of the investment ban and assets freeze directed against the FRY and to adopt a travel ban on senior FRY officials and businessmen with ties to the regime. Finally, the UK has supported our proposal that NATO implement a maritime inspection regime to prevent delivery to the FRY of war material including petroleum products.

Southeastern European Initiative. As you discussed with Blair Saturday, we seek to use the Summit to launch an initiative aimed at transforming southeastern Europe from the continent's primary sough of instability to a region with a realistic prospect of joining the Euro-Atlantic mainstream. To achieve this, we need to involve the United States, NATO, the EU, OSQE, international financial institutions and the states in the region themselves. hope to build on existing frameworks, including especially our own Southeast European Cooperative Initiative (SECI), the EU's "Royaumont" process for regional cooperation, and regularized consultations among Southeast European Defense Ministers (SEDM).
