Scope and Content

FOIA 2019-0520-F is a request for video recordings of a weekly radio address taping on October 23, 1993. The recording session occurred in the Oval Office at the White House. Following the session President William Jefferson Clinton greets guests in attendance including actress Rhea Perlman, actor Danny Devito, family of Betty Currie, and family of Tony Lake, among other guests present.

System of Arrangement

Records that were responsive to this FOIA request were found in one collection area and one series—Clinton Presidential Records: Video Recordings of the White House Television Office and the series therein – Video Recordings Relating to the Clinton Administration. Processing is done at the individual item level for video recordings, while maintain tape run time integrity frequently results in the incidental processing of video recordings that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
