September 10, 1993

DATE, TIME AND PLACE: September 10, 1993; 5:28 p.m. - 5:32 p.m. EDT  
Sunnyvale, California

The President: Hello. (U)

King Hussein: Hello Mr. President. (U)

The President: How are you? (U)

King Hussein: How are you, sir? (U)

The President: I'm very well, thank you. I'm here with the Vice President. We've been celebrating this historic agreement between Israel and the PLO and looking forward to an agreement with Jordan. (U)

King Hussein: I hope very much to work it out, Mr. President. We have done everything we can to help the Palestinians work it out. We hope to see what we have worked for, for many years. (U)

The President: I just wanted to call to tell you how grateful we are for the work you've done and how big a supporter we are. We will be with you to the very end. (C)

King Hussein: Thank you very much. I hope we will be able to ratify the agreement, agenda, as soon as the Palestinians have completed their ceremony in the next two days. We will follow soon after. (C)

The President: You think, within a day or so after them, you will do it? (C)

King Hussein: Yes, in a day or two. [redacted] 1.4b, 1.4d

King Hussein: Hello, Hello? (U)

The President: Hello? (U)

King Hussein: Hello, Mr. President. (U)

The President: Hello, how are you? (U)

King Hussein: Thank you very much, I am well. It is a pleasure to hear from you. (U)

The President: You probably know why I am calling. I'm trying to work though the UN Security Council Resolution coming up. I'm faced with a difficult decision and under pressure from many members of Congress to veto the resolution. [redacted] EQ 13526 1.4d
