Summary of Conclusions

It was agreed that:

- The USG will develop and agree with EU countries a set of conditions for lifting the sanctions imposed upon the FRY during the Kosovo crisis. (Action: State) (C)
- In planning for the international provisional administration of Kosovo, the USG will encourage the UN to restrict to the extent possible Belgrade's jurisdiction over Kosovo. (Action: State) (C)
- The USG will prepare a draft statement on Kosovo to be issued at the G-8 Summit covering political, security, reconstruction and civil implementation issues. (Action: State, NSC) (C)
- The USG will use the G-8 Summit and the US-EU Summit to prepare for an early donors' conference on Kosovo focused on immediate humanitarian requirements. (Action: State, NSC) (C)

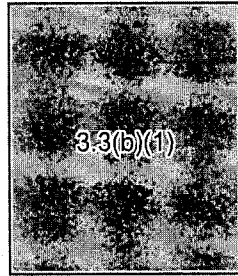

KOSOVO COORDINATION COUNCIL MEETING
June 11, 1999

It was decided that -
* JCS will contact SACEUR to advise of Council guidance that
military
humanitarian airdrops to IDPs begin as soon as possible, despite

UNHCR's reluctance -- unless SACEUR believes assistance can move more effectively via other means in the same time frame. PRM will communicate this to UNHCR via Embassy/Geneva on an info basis.

* NSC will invite PM Assistant Secretary Eric Newsom to the next Coordination Council meeting to brief on plans for the IPA.

* Coordinating Council representatives will provide comments on proposed refugee repatriation principles to PRM.

* Coordinating Council endorsed IWG recommendation and Deputies concurrence to defer to UNHCR's guidance regarding the continuation of the refugee relocation program. PRM will maintain close communications with UNHCR on this issue.

* DoD will complete construction and winterization of Camp Hope, but will suspend construction of additional two planned camps in Albania

* PRM will obtain from UNHCR and relevant others an evaluation of whether refugees in camps in the Kukes area would return to Kosovo before the winter or stay in Kukes.

The UN intends to effect coordination and combined planning with KFOR at the operational-level, initially in Skopje beginning early next week. The UN has identified 2 senior-level persons to organize interaction

with KFOR. Beginning Sunday, the UN advance team will begin arriving Skopje. They will establish a planning and logistic HQ at the old UNPREDEP facilities in Skopje. On Monday and Tuesday approx 50 persons from UNHQ will arrive. Throughout the week another approx 25 persons drawn from existing UN field missions will arrive. (The US Army colonel that serves as head of mission planning in DPKO will be on the team. We intend to send an OSD person as well.) This UN advance team of 75 experts will serve as the advance HQ of the IPA and will develop the detailed operational-level plan, in addition to establishing initial logistics and communications for the IPA and ICTY. The UN intends to deploy to Pristina within a week. First they will have to work out arrangements with KFOR concerning some basic sustainment inside Kosovo (purchase of POL, EOD clearance of a facility, emergency MEDEVAC, etc.).

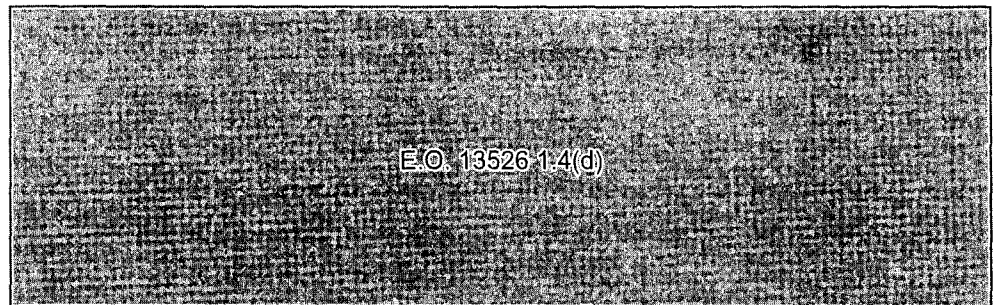
