SUBJECT: Your Telephone Call with Mr. Nixon

Purpose

You indicated you wished to discuss with Mr. Nixon his impressions of the situation in Russia following his recent trip to Moscow, and tell him about our policy priorities toward Russia.

Background

Former President Richard Nixon was in Moscow during the week of February 15, and he used the visit as a platform to reemphasize his strong view that Russia must be a top priority for the United States. According to the New York Times, Mr. Nixon stressed that:

- The new Russia is an investment in peace, prosperity and freedom;
- Success of Russia's economic and political reforms will spell billions in investments and thousands of jobs; failure could mean redoubled military spending;
- A successful Russia would be a powerful antidote to the Chinese model, living proof for the Third World of the benefits of freedom.

During an interview on the Today Show, Mr. Nixon strongly endorsed making Russia our main priority in foreign policy:

"What happens to Russia is by far the most important foreign policy issue of this administration or of our time. If the Russian reforms fail, it's going to completely destroy all of the initiatives that President Clinton has at home."

POINTS TO BE MADE FOR
TELEPHONE CONVERSATION WITH MR. NIXON

-- Strobe Talbott and Toby Gati were pleased to talk to you before your recent visit to Moscow. They are glad that you are keeping the lines of communication open to this White House, and so am I.

-- Russia is a top priority for the United States. You and I agree that we must strongly support President Yeltsin and the democratic and economic reforms that he is working to implement.

-- I know that you were an early advocate of moving away from Gorbachev to Yeltsin, and have been a strong supporter of Yeltsin since. How engaged do you think Yeltsin is at the present time? Is he in charge?

I also heard that you met in Moscow with representatives of the "responsible right" such as Nikolay Travkin and Arkady Volsky, the leaders of Civic Union. Do you think such individuals will be able to hold together as an opposition group? Will they be able to work with Yeltsin?

-- On your trip back home, I understand that you saw Francois Mitterand and spoke to him of the value of multilateral assistance to Russia. What is your assessment of the possibilities for building more such assistance with our allies in Europe and the Pacific?

-- I wanted to let you know that I agree with your view that a downward path for Russia is not in the U.S. interests. If reform fails there and a nationalist conservative regime comes to power, then we will likely be faced with more such regimes all over the former Soviet Union. The reform movement would die in each of the republics.

-- We know that we have work to do. The assistance programs as they were previously structured did not convey a coherent sense of U.S. policy. So that we can have the greatest impact on Russia's economy as well as on its foreign and domestic policy, we will be concentrating our efforts in key areas:

Expanding trade and investment, unfreezing the debt negotiations, and developing technical assistance.

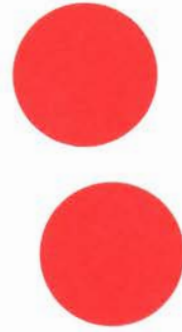

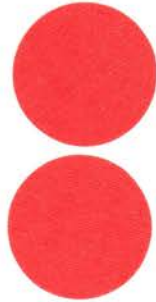

Attached at Tab I is a schedule proposal for a Presidential telephone call to former President Nixon prior to his trip to Russia. During his October 30-November 6 visit, Nixon will meet with President Yeltsin and other key reformers in the Yeltsin Government. We believe a call to Nixon before he departs (October 27-29) would provide the President a good opportunity to explain our policy and to insure that Nixon will be supportive publicly.

In addition to a proposed telephone call, we also recommend that the President meet with Nixon upon his return from Moscow to get a briefing on Nixon's meetings (Tab II). We believe Nixon's insights into political developments in Russia would be useful. Nixon intends to speak out publicly and write a long New York Times piece after his return. A meeting would give us another chance to insure he understands our policy in the run-up to the December elections. We recommend that the President meet with Nixon for one-half hour at his convenience the week of November 8-12.

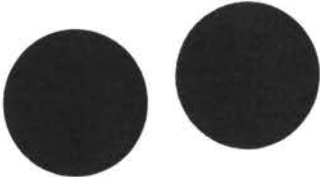

I. PURPOSE

To discuss with former President Nixon his March 4-17 trip to Russia, Ukraine and Germany, and to review your latest thinking on U.S. policy.

II. BACKGROUND

Former President Richard Nixon will visit Russia and Ukraine from March 4-16. He will see Yeltsin, Chernomyrdin, Grachev and other Russian leaders, including Zhirinovskiy and Rutskoi, and Kravchuk in Kiev. Nixon may also stop in Bonn to see Chancellor Kohl to discuss his trip and the importance of continuing U.S.-German collaboration on Russia and Ukraine.

Your call to Nixon is intended to let him know that we support his trip and to give him a brief summary of your views before he departs. Since Nixon plans to speak and write publicly about events in Russia and our policy upon his return, it is important that we continue to keep in touch with him. He supported you publicly last spring after the Vancouver Summit and his views still carry weight not only among Republicans but with a wider audience as well. As you remember, his public criticism of President Bush's Russia policy in early 1992 was damaging.

Nixon invited Nick Burns to lunch last week for a three-hour briefing on the Administration's policy and perspectives on Russia. He told Nick that he continues to support your overall policy although he believes we should be tougher publicly on Russian foreign policy toward its neighbors. Nixon volunteered to give Yeltsin and Chernomyrdin messages that he would describe as his own but which would be helpful to us. He and Nick agreed on three points to stress with the Russians:

1) That the U.S. wants very much to support their economic reforms but will find it difficult to galvanize international support if the reforms slow too much;

2) That the Russians should move quickly to conclude major oil and gas deals with American companies to demonstrate to our business community that they are serious about expanding trade and investment;

3) To let the Russians know that an overly aggressive foreign policy in the Near Abroad could undercut support in the West in general and in the Congress in particular. Nixon will cite rapid progress in troop withdrawals from Estonia and Latvia as especially important to help on this issue.

You will want to review some of these issues with Nixon in your phone call and let him know we hope it will be possible to meet with him after his trip.

POINTS TO BE MADE TELEPHONE CALL TO FORMER PRESIDENT NIXON

- Mr. President, I'm delighted to speak with you again.
- I understand you will be leaving March 3 for a long trip to Russia, Ukraine and Germany.
- The first thing I wanted you to know is that I think this is an important trip and I fully support it.
- I would be interested in hearing more about who you will meet and where you will go.
 - Tom Pickering has told the Russians that we hope they will make every effort to make your trip a success. We have asked Ambassador Bill Miller in Kiev and Ambassador Dick Holbrooke in Bonn to make similar preparations with their host governments.
 - I know that Nick Burns has briefed you on our policy and view of events there. Please let me know if we can help you in any other way to prepare for the trip.
- I hope that we can find time to discuss your trip when you return.
 - I know that Strobe Talbott has also written you to suggest a dinner with him when you are free after your trip.
- This is clearly a challenging time in our relationship with Russia. Events since the election make clear to us that 1994 will be a potentially difficult year in the relationship.
 - I believe very strongly, however, that we should stick firmly to our policy of engagement with Russia and of economic assistance to support the reformers.
 - I am convinced that our most important long-term national security interests require us to seek an improved relationship with Russia.
 - We have no illusions. We know that economic reform is likely to slow and that some Russians want to pursue a more aggressive policy with their neighbors.
 - We will continue our bilateral aid because it flows mainly to reformers outside the government. We'll try to maintain the macro-economic assistance but can only do so if the reforms continue.
 - On foreign policy, we have actually made progress with Russia on Ukraine (the trilateral deal) and in the Baltics (the Russian troops should be withdrawn by summer). I laid down a public marker in the State of the Union speech that

Russia should deploy its troops abroad only when the countries involved consent and consistent with international principles.

(If Nixon asks if you have any objections to his meetings with Zhirinovskiy and Rutskoi:

- You understand, of course, why I didn't meet Zhirinovskiy on the trip.
- But you are a private citizen and should feel free to meet whomever you like there.)

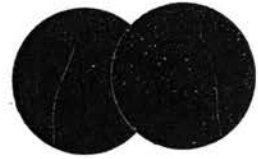
