**All Presidential series photographs from the Clinton Administration taken from May 27, 1994, through June 2, 1994 & June 6, 1994**

### **Extent**

Approximately 2,244 photographs in color and black & white film processed from 35mm negatives.

### **Access**

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.

### **Scope and Content**

FOIA 2016-0984-F (Segment 50) is a request for all Clinton Administration White House photographs taken May 27, 1994, through June 2, 1994; June 6, 1994.

The photographs processed in this segment contains photographic events pertaining to arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President William Jefferson Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, White House Staff, and others for the time period processed.

**Photographs from May 27, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton greets an official from South Africa in the Oval Office. Vice President Albert Gore, Tony Lake, and George Stephanopoulos are present in the Oval Office.

President Clinton and Vice President Albert Gore greet Jim Morris, Comedian and Impersonator, in the Oval Office. Dennis Alpert is present in the Oval Office.

President Clinton participates in interviews in the Cabinet Room and Roosevelt Room with British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC), Voice of America and other media outlets. The President greets the media crews.

President Clinton meets in the Oval Office with George Stephanopoulos, Dee Dee Myers, Tony Lake, Jenonne Walker, and others.

President Clinton greets a Make-A-Wish child in the Oval Office.

President Clinton tapes a radio address in the Roosevelt Room.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton talk alone in the Ground Floor residence hallway.

President Clinton talks on the telephone in the Oval Office with Prime Minister Tansu Ciller of Turkey. Jim Reed and Donald Kerrick are present in the Oval Office.

**Photographs from May 28, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton plays golf with Representative Mike Russo, Representative George Miller, and Mike Bronfein at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club in Gainesville, Virginia.

Nicole Boxer and Tony Rodham pose for wedding portrait photos at the White House.

**Photographs from May 29, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, and Chelsea Clinton arrive at Foundry United Methodist Church for church services in Washington, D.C. The Clintons depart Foundry United Methodist Church.

**Photographs from May 30, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton greet World War II Veterans and their spouses in the Blue Room of the White House. Guests include General John Shalikashvili, General Merrill McPeak, General Gordon Sullivan, General Carl Mundy, Secretary William Perry, and others. The Clintons deliver remarks in the East Room. Postmaster General Marvin Runyon makes remarks and unveils World War II souvenir stamps in the East Room. President Clinton signs two proclamations including declaring the day to be prayer for peace, "Memorial Day," and the other setting aside June 6 as "D-Day National Recognition Day." President Clinton meets with veterans including Elizabeth P. McIntosh in the Oval Office after the Memorial Day Breakfast ceremony.

George Stephanopoulos sits on a wrought iron chair on the South Lawn and reads a newspaper.

President Clinton lays a wreath on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. President Clinton delivers a Memorial Day speech at the cemetery. Memorial Day ceremony participants include Chaplain (Major) James W. Jones, Jr., Major General Fred A. Gordon, Commander of the Military District of Washington, and Elizabeth McIntosh, Veteran of World War II.

**Photographs from May 31, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton goes jogging in Washington, D.C.

President Clinton and Vice President Albert Gore meet with Dr. Joao Havelange, President of the Federation Internationale de Football (FIFA), and others in the Oval Office. Dr. Havelange and others present President Clinton and Vice President with World Cup 1994 items including a soccer ball, statue, and hats.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton greets visitors in the Diplomatic Reception Room.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton meets with Jack Fuller of the Chicago Tribune in the Map Room.

President Clinton participates in briefing regarding the upcoming D-Day Anniversary events in the Oval Office with Vice President Albert Gore, Secretary Warren Christopher, Secretary William Perry, General John Shalikashvili, Jenonne Walker, Jesse Brown, Nancy Soderberg, Mark Gearan, David Gergen, Leon Panetta, and others.

President Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Vice President Albert Gore, and Tipper Gore participate in the swearing in ceremony for the President's Council in the Rose Garden. Ceremony participants include Florence Griffith Joyner, Tom McMillen, and Secretary Donna Shalala.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton greet Bernard "Bernie" Meyer in the Oval Office.

President Clinton greets the Sallis family in the Oval Office.

President Clinton greets Sarah Ryan and her guest on the White House Colonnade.

President Clinton meets in the Oval Office with Jack Fuller of the Chicago Tribune.

President Clinton greets Andie Poole Wolcott and her daughter in the Oval Office.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton talks alone with Secretary Donna Shalala in the Outer Oval Office. President Clinton talks with Secretary Shalala and the First Lady in the Oval Office.

**Photographs from June 1, 1994, are as follows:**

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton participate in a ceremony at the First Division Monument near the Old Executive Office Building. The President delivers remarks at the monument prior to departing for Rome, Italy. The First Division Monument honors the U.S. Army's First Infantry which landed at Normandy on D-Day in 1944. The Clintons greet ceremony guests on the Ellipse prior to departing for Rome, Italy.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at Ciampino Airport in Rome, Italy.

President Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, and Dorothy Rodham arrive at the Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew's residence "Villa Taverna." They sign the guest book and tour the residence with Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew and his wife Rose-Anne.

**Photographs from June 2, 1994, are as follows:**

Views of police on horseback around the Palazzo del Quirinale in Rome. Views of the press outside the Vatican.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the Palazzo del Quirinale. They participate in a brief arrival ceremony with President Oscar Luigi Scalfaro. President Clinton participates in a bilateral meeting with President Scalfaro.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton tour the Sistine Chapel at the Vatican. They are accompanied by Dr. Pietrangeli, Director of the Vatican Museum.

President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the Vatican San Damaso Courtyard. Ambassador Raymond Flynn accompanied them. President Clinton meets with Pope John Paul II in the Papal Library.

Marilyn Jacanin and John Lobe have lunch in the White House Staff Mess. Janet Philips, White House Photo Office Librarian, and Stephanie Cross and her family have lunch in the White House Staff Mess.

**System of Arrangement**

Records that were responsive to this FOIA request were found in one collection area and one series—Clinton Presidential Records: Photographs of the White House Photograph Office and the series therein—Photographs Relating to the Clinton Administration. Processing is done at the Folder/Contact sheet level. While this method maintains folder/contact sheet integrity, it frequently results in the processing of photographs that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
