



## **Inventory for FOIA Request 2016-0984-F AV Segment 51 (1994, P16100-P16199)**

**All Presidential series photographs from the Clinton Administration taken from June 2, 1994 through June 3, 1994.**

### **Extent**

Approximately 2,775 photographs in color and black & white film processed from 35mm negatives.,

### **Access**

Collection is open to all researchers. Access to Clinton Presidential Records is governed by the Presidential Records Act (PRA) (44 U.S.C. Chapter 22, as amended) and the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 U.S.C. 552, as amended) and therefore records may be restricted in whole or in part in accordance with legal exemptions.

### **Scope and Content**

FOIA 2016-0984-F (Segment 51) is a request for all Clinton Administration White House photographs taken from January 1, 1994 through December 31, 1994.

The photographs processed in this segment were created from June 2, 1994 through June 3, 1994.. The segment contains photographs pertaining to arrivals, departures, meetings, ceremonies, press briefings, interviews, photo-ops, etc., involving President William Jefferson Clinton, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, White House Staff, and others for the time period processed.

One contact sheet responsive to this segment was previously processed in FOIA case number 2022-0198-F.

**Photographs from June 2, 1994 are as follows:**

President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at Capitoline Hill in City Hall in Rome, Italy. Present is Mayor Francesco Rutelli. The President and Mayor Rutelli meet in the Mayor's office and view the Roman Forum with Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi. Also present are First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton, Veronica Berlusconi, Ambassador Boris Biancheri, Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew, and Tony Lake. President Clinton meets with senior staff including Tony Lake, David Gergen, Mark Gearan, Jeremy Rosner, George Stephanopoulos, and Brian McPartlin. The President addresses the citizens of Rome. Later, the First Lady tours the Capitoline Museum.

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the Palazzo del Quirinale in Rome, Italy. The President and First Lady participate in an arrival ceremony with President Oscar Luigi Scalfaro and Mariana Scalfaro. President Clinton participates in a bilateral meeting with President Scalfaro. The First Lady tours the palace with Mariana Scalfaro and Rose-Anne Bartholomew.

President William Jefferson Clinton arrives at the Palazzo Chigi in Rome, Italy. The President participates in a bilateral meeting with Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi. Also present includes Secretary of State Warren Christopher, Leon Panetta, Tony Lake, David Gergen, Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew, and Stephen Oxman. Photographed prior to the meeting includes Nancy Soderberg and George Stephanopoulos. The President speaks on a telephone.

President William Jefferson Clinton meets with senior staff in Rome, Italy. Present includes Secretary of State Warren Christopher, Mark Gearan, David Gergen, George Stephanopoulos, Tony Lake, Ricki Seidman, Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew, Nancy Soderberg, Jenonne Walker, Michael Waldman, John Podesta, Andrew Friendly, and Wendy Smith.

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton proceed to the Presidential limousine. Photographed are the press pool laying on grass. The President and First Lady arrive at Villa Madama. Present is Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi and Veronica Berlusconi. The Clintons and Berlusconis proceed to the Salotto D'Angelo. Present includes Secretary of State Warren Christopher, Senator Claiborne Pell, Melanne Verveer, Lisa Caputo, Bill Burton, Bruce Lindsey, George Stephanopoulos, Pat Griffin, Ricki Seidman, Mark Gearan, Tony Lake, David Gergen, and Molly Raiser. The President and Prime Minister make remarks during a dinner & toast.

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the San Damaso courtyard at the Vatican. Present are Ambassador Raymond Flynn and Monsignor Dino Monduzzi. The Clintons and Dorothy Rodham meet with Pope John Paul II in the Papal Library. The Pope greets the United States delegation and presents each with a gift. The Clintons greet Cardinal William Baum and Cardinal Edmund C. Szoka. The President delivers remarks to the press regarding his meeting with the Pope. The President confers with Ambassador Flynn, Mark Gearan, George Stephanopoulos, and Tony Lake. Later, the President and First Lady tour the Sistine Chapel. Present includes Dr. Carlo Pietrangeli (Director of the Vatican museum), among others.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton visits the American Academy of Rome in Rome, Italy. The First Lady tours the facility and looks at artwork. Later the First Lady greets students in the Piazza Navone.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton attends a reception at Villa Taverna in Rome, Italy. Present includes Rose-Anne Bartholomew and Sophia Loren, among others.

**Photographs from June 3, 1994 are as follows:**

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton participate at an event at the United States Embassy in Rome, Italy. Present include Secretary of State Warren Christopher, Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew, and Rose-Anne Bartholomew, among others.

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the Roman Forum in Rome, Italy. Present are Professor Enrico Bruschini & Professor Andriano la Regina. The Clintons tour the Forum. Also photographed is photographer Wilfredo Lee.

President William Jefferson Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton arrive at the Sicily Rome American cemetery in Nettuno, Italy. Present includes Joe Bevilacqua and Ambassador Reginald Bartholomew. The President pays respect at grave sites and is accompanied by June Wandrey (World War II nurse), Robert Schafer, Senator Robert Dole, Senator Ernest Hollings, Senator Daniel Inoué, and Senator Claiborne Pell. Graves visited by the President include those of Robert Waugh, Sylvester Baer, Ophelia Tiley, and The Unknown Soldier. The President and First Lady participate in a ceremony to honor those that fought on Nettuno Beach and Anzio. Present includes President Oscar Luigi Scalfaro, Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi, Secretary of Veterans' Affairs Jesse Brown, and John Shirley. The President and First Lady greet the Senate delegation in the memorial museum, sign a guest book, and participate in a reception with American veterans. Also photographed includes George Stephanopoulos, Ricki Seidman, David Gergen, Nancy Soderberg, Andrew Friendly, and Wendy Smith.

**System of Arrangement**

Records that were responsive to this FOIA request were found in one collection area and one series—Clinton Presidential Records: Photographs of the White House Photograph Office and the series therein—Photographs Relating to the Clinton Administration. Processing is done at the Folder/Contact sheet level. While this method maintains folder/contact sheet integrity, it frequently results in the processing of photographs that are not wholly responsive to the subject area.
